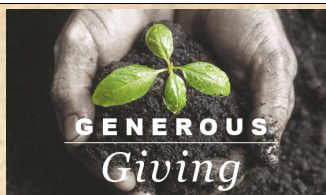

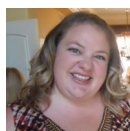

All adults and confirmed teens are invited to join us as we look

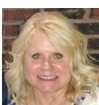

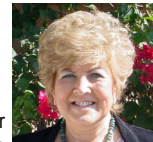

The world of the New Testament is so far removed from our modern world that it is sometimes difficult to understand what we hear in the Sunday readings or read in Scripture and how it relates to God's message of salvation for our world today. Our scripture study this year is titled, "Panorama of the New Testament", a study which will reveal the continued plan of salvation as it unfolded among the first generations of Christians from the missionary preaching of St. Paul and the Gospel stories of Jesus through the persecution of the early Christians as encoded in the book of Revelation and God's promise of a "New Heaven and a New Earth."

This overview is beneficial both for newcomers to scripture study, as well as those who have already studied much of the New Testament.

Our study meets on Monday evenings, beginning on Sept. 18, from 7:00 – 8:30 pm on the first floor of the John Paul II building and is repeated on Thursday mornings which began on Sept 21, in our Parish Library. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 11 de febrero de 1858 la Virgen María se apareció a tres niños franceses del pueblito de Lourdes. Allí brotaron aguas milagrosas con el poder de sanar enfermos. Eventualmente se construyó en Lourdes un santuario en honor de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes y millones de enfermos han recurrido a las aguas curativas. Muchos de los que visitan el santuario son latinos, porque a los latinos nos encantan los milagros y lo milagroso.

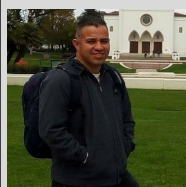

Why do I have to confess to a Priest ?

The Sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession is often misunderstood. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is Christ's gift to us. The root of all sin is pride; its antidote is humility. As our Holy Father Pope Francis said during his Wednesday audience on Feb. 19, 2014, **"Someone can say, I confess my sins only to God. Yes, you can say to God, forgive me, and say your sins. But our sins are also against our brothers, and against the Church. This is why it is necessary to ask forgiveness of the Church and of our brothers, in the person of the Priest"**. The Priest does not act on his own, he acts in the name of Jesus and on behalf of his Church. Jesus gives his power to forgive sins to his priests: See John 20: 23 ("sins you forgive are forgiven them.....whose sins you retain are retained").
