Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel!"*

"Rite of Sending"

This weekend at the 9:AM Mass, we, the community of St. Peter & St. Paul, will be celebrating the 'Rite of Sending' for some of our adults who are in the catechumenate.

For over a year now they have been walking a journey of faith, discerning, and learning about the Catholic way of life. It is now time for them to move forward and prepare to receive their initiation sacraments. Our community is "sending" them to the bishop for 'The Rite of Election' which will be celebrated next Sunday at St. Francis Xavier Cabrini Catholic Church in Yucaipa.

At the Rite of Sending, their godparents testify on their behalf, to you, the community of St. Peter and St. Paul asking for your prayers and support as they continue with this next phase of their initiation process.

This year, three adults and two children are seeking baptism. (The children celebrate the Rites of Sending and Election separately from the adults).

One, who is baptized in another faith tradition, is seeking to establish full communion and make her profession of faith in the Catholic Church. All will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil on Mar. 31st.

We invite those who may be interested in learning more about the Church to join us on Tuesday evenings. Adults meet in the parish library from 7:30PM to 9:30PM.

SEVEN LIVELY VIRTUES**

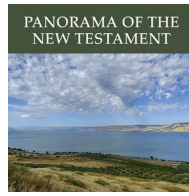

The world of the New Testament is so far removed from our modern world that it is sometimes difficult to understand what we hear in the Sunday readings or read in Scripture and how it relates to God's message of salvation for our world today. Our scripture study this year is titled, "Panorama of the New Testament", a study which will reveal the continued plan of salvation as it unfolded among the first generations of Christians from the missionary preaching of St. Paul and the Gospel stories of Jesus through the persecution of the early Christians as encoded in the book of Revelation and God's promise of a "New Heaven and a New Earth." This overview is beneficial both for newcomers to scripture study, as well as those who have already studied much of the New Testament. The Courage to Speak and to Act Against Abortion

The mother's womb should be the very safest place for a child. Tragically, it has become the most dangerous location- more dangerous than any battlefield or terrorist target. In some cities, about 40 percent of pregnancies end in abortion.

To defend these innocent children and to speak and act on their behalf takes courage. Perhaps family and friends may not like our pro-life stance. Perhaps we may lose business. We all know people who have had an abortion so perhaps we do not want to offend a relative or loved one. It is all too easy to make excuses or make calculations in our minds and hearts, which often results in paralyzed inaction and apathy. We are always told of reasons why we cannot speak up against abortion. If the priest speaks in Church, he will be rebuked by some who will try to argue it's too political; if we speak in the political arena, we are told it's too religious. If we speak in the media, we are told it's too disturbing; in our schools and colleges, it's too disruptive. On the public streets, it's too distressing for children; in the business world it's too 'controversial, in the family it's too divisive, and in social settings, it's too impolite or politically incorrect. So, if abortion is plainly wrong and inhumane (which it most definitely is), how do we do what is right and where do we go to say so? The unambiguous answer is that we must stop looking for a risk-free place to fight abortion, and have the courage to speak up in all these arenas! Let's stop counting the cost to ourselves if we speak up and start counting the cost to the innocent children, if we remain silent.

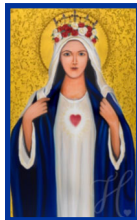

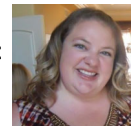

A DIOS TODA LA GLORIA - Una característica peculiar de la primera parte del Evangelio según san Marcos es que en general Jesús obra un milagro y luego le dice al beneficiario del milagro que no se lo cuente a nadie. Se ha especulado mucho al respecto: Marcos está preparando el terreno para el gran “secreto” que se revelará cuando Pedro proclame que Jesús es el Mesías en Cesárea de Filipo; otros comentaristas más escépticos sostienen que Jesús, quien era plenamente consciente de su naturaleza humana, sabía que la mejor manera de difundir la Buena Nueva era pidiéndole a las personas que la mantuvieran en secreto. La reflexión de esta manera de guardar el secreto que nos resulta muy útil, sin embargo, es que Jesús estaba comenzando su ministerio público de la forma en que describe Pablo: lo estaba haciendo por la gloria de Dios, no para beneficio propio sino para beneficio de todos. Pablo después escribiría a los filipenses que Jesús “se rebajó a sí mismo” para parecerse a nosotros. Y vemos cómo esta humildad se pone en práctica hoy en la curación del leproso. Jesús está intentando revelar la presencia del Reino de Dios entre las personas, no para recibir gloria sino para que Dios fuera glorificado por él. Imitar esta forma de obrar, lo cual Pablo sugiere que hagan las facciones judías y griegas cristianas de Corintio, todavía nos resulta muy útil hoy.

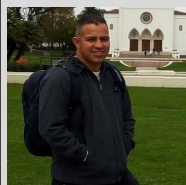

RCIA - A TEACHING MOMENT

Explain the "Preparation of the Gifts and the Altar".



The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the "Preparation of the Gifts and the Altar". As the ministers prepare the altar, representatives of the people bring forward the bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of Christ. The celebrant blesses and praises God for these gifts and places them on the altar, the place of the Eucharistic sacrifice. In addition to the bread and wine, monetary gifts for the support of the Church and the care of the poor may be brought forward. The Priest says the following prayers either out loud or to himself. "Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life". "Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become our spiritual drink". If the Priest chooses to say it out loud, the congregation responds after each prayer with, "Blessed be God forever". The Prayer over the Offerings concludes this preparation and disposes all for the Eucharistic Prayer.





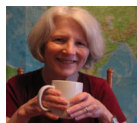
