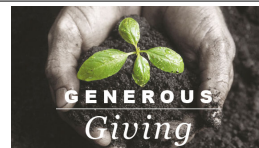

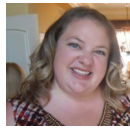

All adults and confirmed teens are invited to join us as we look

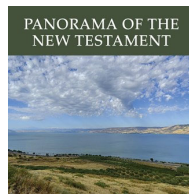

THE NEW TESTAMENT

Sept. 2017 - May 2018**



The world of the New Testament is so far removed from our modern world that it is sometimes difficult to understand what we hear in the Sunday readings or read in Scripture and how it relates to God's message of salvation for our world today. Our scripture study this year is titled, "Panorama of the New Testament", a study which will reveal the continued plan of salvation as it unfolded among the first generations of Christians from the missionary preaching of St. Paul and the Gospel stories of Jesus through the persecution of the early Christians as encoded in the book of Revelation and God's promise of a "New Heaven and a New Earth."

This overview is beneficial both for newcomers to scripture study, as well as those who have already studied much of the New Testament.

Our study meets on Monday evenings, beginning on Sept. 18, from 7:00 – 8:30 pm on the first floor of the John Paul II building and is repeated on Thursday mornings which began on Sept 21, in our Parish Library. 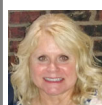

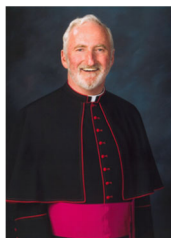

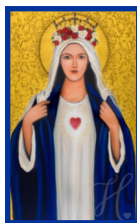

LAS EXIGENCIAS DE SER DISCÍPULO

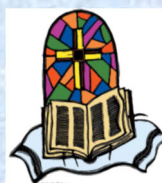
Hoy ya encontramos lecturas con el tono penitencia de Cuaresma. Nive ayuna durante cuarenta días, el salmista nos recuerda que sólo Dios puede indicarles el camino a los pecadores, san Pablo nos muestra que todas las cosas y los acontecimientos de este mundo son transitorios y Jesús nos dice: “Arrepiéntanse” antes de llamar a sus nuevos seguidores. “Sígueme”, dice Jesús, pero si realmente vivimos los mandamientos y las exigencias de ser discípulos por el Bautismo, nos daremos cuenta de nuestra necesidad de conversión, de nuestro arrepentimiento, nuestra necesidad de creer plenamente en el Evangelio. El Evangelio de hoy comienza recordándonos lo que le sucedió a Juan Bautista por vivir plenamente su vocación como heraldo de Cristo y del Evangelio: fue arrestado, encarcelado y martirizado. Si bien pocos de nosotros sufriremos consecuencias tan extremas, todos debemos estar preparados para enfrentar algún tipo de rechazo por hacerle caso al llamado de Jesús, vivir el Reino de Dios que está próximo, arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados y creer en la buena nueva de salvación.

Como la mayor parte de los indígenas americanos, los quechuas consideran la tierra como pertenencia de la comunidad humana. De ella come y vive todo ser viviente. Desde la llegada de los europeos la tierra americana ha sido explotada y con ella los indígenas también. El siglo pasado unos campesinos ecuatorianos dirigidos por Segundo Francisco comenzaron a reunirse con el Ministerio de Agricultura y el Instituto Ecuatoriano de Reforma Agraria y Colonización. Que agencias civiles tomen interés por los derechos del indígena es siempre “buena nueva”. Lamentablemente lo que es “buena nueva” para la muchedumbre pobre es “mala noticia” para los poderosos. Uno de éstos decidió vengarse en contra de los campesinos. En su rabia, asesinó al joven Segundo Francisco de sólo 25 años de edad. Pero su muerte, como la de todo mártir, no fue en vano. Su sangre derramada sobre la madre tierra ha ido sembrando más movimientos por los derechos de los indígenas.

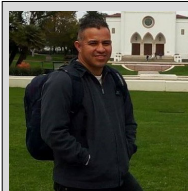

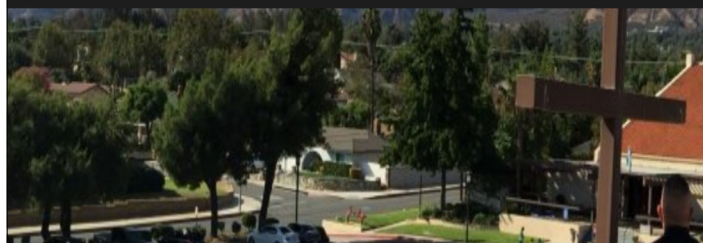

7. SET ASIDE SUNDAY AS A TRUE DAY OF REST.

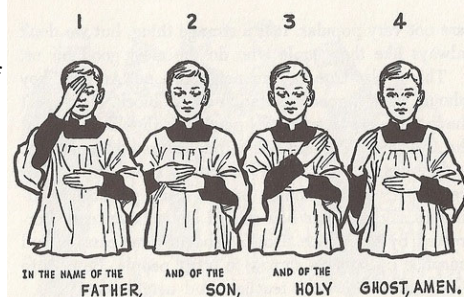

RCIA - A TEACHING MOMENT

WHY DO WE MAKE THE SIGN OF THE CROSS?

Our Lord's death sanctified (made holy) the symbol of the cross. The cross went from being regarded as an instrument of shame, to the symbol of Jesus' triumph and victory over sin and death and a sign of our faith in Him. That is why we make the sign of the cross. If done with reverence and thought, the sign of the cross is a protection from the powers of Satan and a reminder of the power of our Faith. **"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit"**, proclaims for all to see, our belief in the Trinity and the Unity of God in three persons. The touching of the forehead is to show that the Son proceeds from the Father, and that the Holy Spirit proceeds from both the Father and the Son is signified by touching the heart and the two shoulders; while the form of the cross reminds us of our redemption by Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Make the sign of the cross devoutly. It is one of the greatest sacramentals of the Church.

The Bella House - Part I

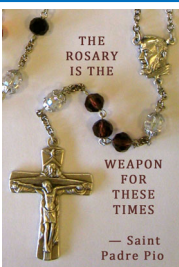
In 2012, two pregnancy counselors at the Birth Choice Women's Center in Dallas, Texas, faced a dilemma. Once a client had chosen life for her baby, then what? Often she was without financial or medical resources to bring her baby to term. Even more challenging, often she had no place to stay during her pregnancy and no one to support her life-affirming, but difficult, decision. Out of this dilemma came a vision, the vision of The Bella House. The word "bella" means beautiful, and as its name implies, The Bella House "celebrates the beauty of every life." After nearly two years of prayer, fund-raising, and strategic planning, The Bella House in the suburb of Plano opened its doors as a transitional home, a safe haven of hospitality, loving care, and personal growth. Its mission was to reach and support a largely underserved segment of our population, the homeless, pregnant woman. Fundamental to the Bella House mission is the belief that true transformation can only occur in an atmosphere of authentic love, namely, the love of God reflected in the good works of a loving people. Mothers can come to Bella House when they are newly pregnant, and can stay up to six months after their baby is born. To date, 19 women have come through its doors. A few have left before giving birth because they have found permanent housing, or have reconciled with the baby's father or their families. Every mother has said she is better for having been at The Bella House, even if her stay was not that long. See more about "The Bella House" in next week's bulletin.

THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

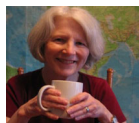
Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.
