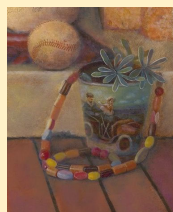

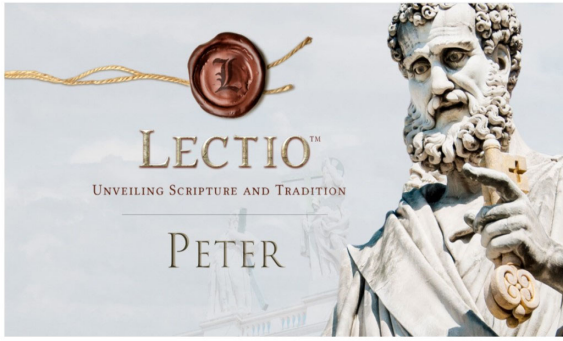

ADULT CONFIRMATION

To be fully initiated into our Catholic Faith, a person needs to have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Often, life circumstances may have prevented a baptized Catholic from completing this process at a younger age. As a result, some adult Catholics may have little understanding of our Catholic Faith or its importance in living a Christian life.



Adults 18 years and older who have completed high school are invited to participate in our Adult Confirmation sessions to gain an adult understanding of the basic teachings of our Catholic Faith in order to prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation and living a full, active Catholic life. The sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession) and Eucharist (Communion) will be part of this preparation, where necessary, in order to complete Christian Initiation.

These sessions are always open to any adults who desire an updated understanding of the teachings of our Church, even if there is no need to prepare for sacraments. Our focus is on those serious questions about being Catholic that often come to mind without knowing where to go for answers.

Our sessions meet on Thursday evenings (September to June) beginning Sept. 13th from 7:00 – 9:00 pm in our John Paul II Center. For further information, please call Mary Ann Anandel at 987-9312 x 250.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE WISDOM LITERATURE of the BIBLE

In the history of wisdom literature, no tradition matches the solace and depth of the wisdom teachings of the Bible, which offers time-honored advice about some of life's most difficult questions: What is the reward of a virtuous life? How can we best deal with the uncertainty of life? Why does evil exist? Why do bad things happen to good people? How does God show his interest and concern for us?

Wisdom literature has to do with the human person, apart from the Old Testament story of Israel as God's chosen people, even though this literature is part of that larger story and also part of our story as people of the New Covenant with Jesus in the community of the Church. Instead, Wisdom literature addresses the issues that are universal to all humans.

Wisdom shows a "human face" in its concern with human nature and the human condition. Wisdom's strength is universalism, as it looks at all people in their most universal, basic categories of good and evil, of parents and children, of women and men, of peasants and princes, of lazy and diligent. For countless people, these ancient writings have offered consolation and insights into the very meaning of existence. The Wisdom literature of the Bible still has much to teach us today.

The Wisdom books which we will be studying include Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Sirach, the Song of Songs, and the Wisdom of Solomon, along with several sessions on Jesus as a Wisdom Teacher.

This study will be offered on **Monday evenings from 7:00 – 8:30 pm beginning on Sept. 17, in the St. Augustine room of the John Paul II Center** and is repeated on **Thursday mornings from 9:00 – 10:30 am beginning on Sept. 20 in the Parish Library.** No registration is necessary, just join us at the time most convenient for you.

RCIA TEACHING MOMENTS:

How does the Church define "Circumcision"?

A term that means "a cutting around". God commanded Abraham and his male descendants to be circumcised as the sign of His covenant with them. Though circumcision was practiced at times by the Samaritans, Arabians, and Egyptians for hygienic reasons, among the Hebrews it was always considered as something religious, as a commandment coming directly from God. The infant Jesus was circumcised in accordance with the Jewish ritual. This occurred eight days after his birth and marks one of the few incidents of His childhood that is recorded in the Scriptures (Luke: 2: 21). Circumcision is replaced by Baptism for the followers of Christ in the New Testament (Acts: 15: 1-12). See the Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraph # 527 for further information

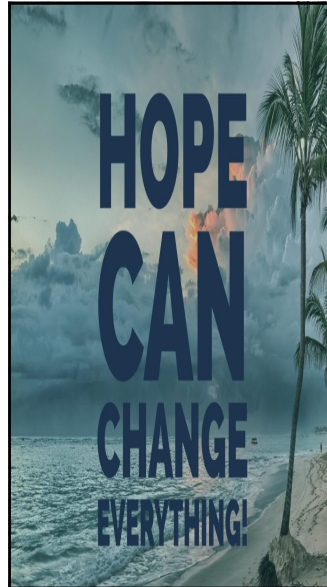

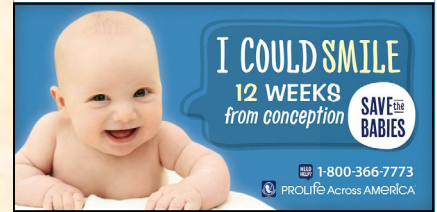
