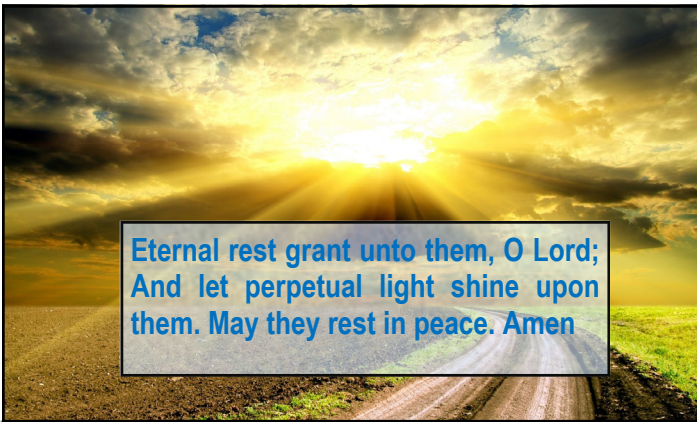

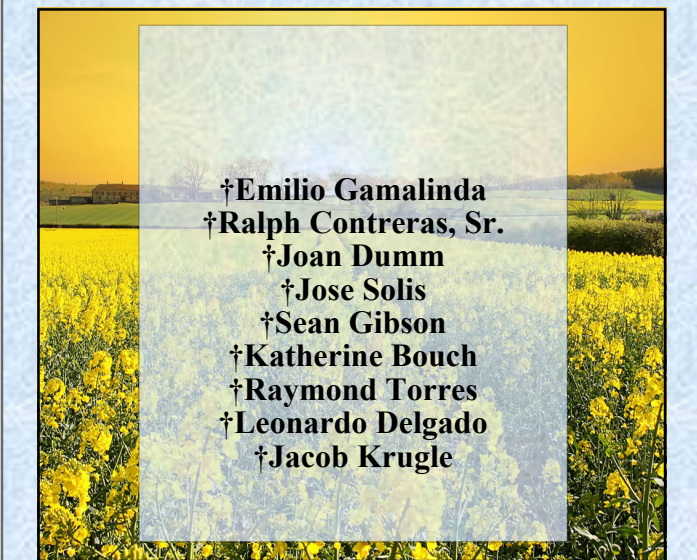

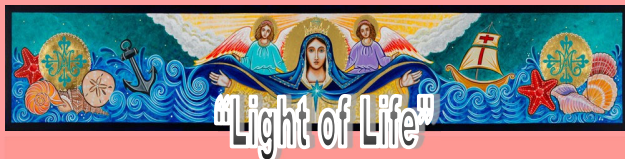

Here I Lay...
Here I lay in a steel cage,
surrounded by men of all race and age.
I look out my window to be greeted with stares,
I yell for help but no one cares.

As we enter into the holiday season, we would like to ask for your help in showing our incarcerated sisters and brothers that some people do care. The Office of Restorative Justice coordinates the distribution of thousands of Christmas cards each year to prisons in our Diocese. We are in need of boxes of new, unsigned Christmas cards (especially Spanish-language cards) which are then given to inmates to send home to their families.

Deadline is Friday, December 7, 2018 in order to meet the prisons' deadlines.

"Your mother and father..." Don Bosco continued.

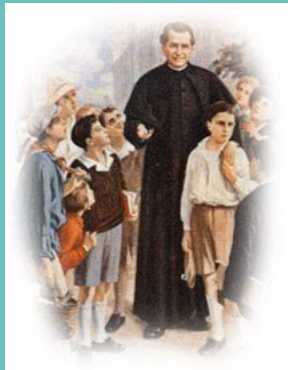
"I'm alone," the boy responded sadly.

After Mass Don Bosco told the boy, "Next Sunday, bring your friends here, and we'll spend the day together."

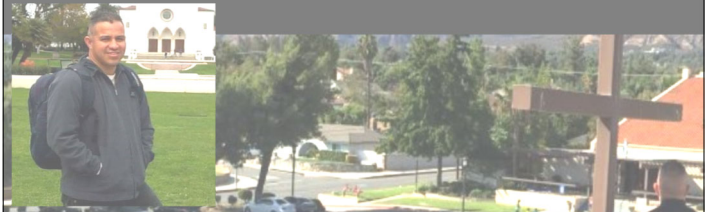

Feb. 22nd is the feast of the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle. Attested as early as the mid-fourth century (in the Depsio martyrum), it has its roots in the commemoration of dead relatives and friends (Parentalia), celebrated in Rome between Feb. 13-22. (Eventually moved to November 2nd) At this commemoration, a chair (cathedra) was left empty for particular deceased persons. Since the actual date of Peter's death was unknown, it came to be commemorated on Feb. 22nd, eventually celebrating his taking pastoral responsibility of the Church of Rome.

This is why we memorialize our beloved deceased family and friends when draping a pew in white during the month of November.
