From the Desk of Father Juan Sandoval ...

**Proper movements during the Holy Mass**

During this season of Easter, I want to speak up and make some awareness about the only and true sacrifice that most Catholics try to live out with faith: **The Holy Mass**. Yes, we are filled with joy and gladness because of the Lord's resurrection but there are some aspects of our faith that requires close attention. There have been times when habits that are not proper are introduced to the Mass. Movements in the Mass that are not in the rubrics (rubrics are the red-letter case printed in the liturgy books like the Roman Missal), that the faithful are not supposed to do. There is some sort of confusion in our Catholic faithful with regards to certain movements that have been introduced spontaneously by the community along the years namely: holding hands during the Our Father, praying for other (s) with extending hands over the community (**something that only the priest can do during the Mass**) as the priest collects all the prayers of the people and presents them on the altar. For instance, I have had encounters with people affirming that extending hands is a 'tradition' blaming us (priests) for "trying" to get rid of this habit. The truth is that extending hands for the lay people is not in the rubrics. Some people are for or against this practice that mimics the Nazi salute which is not appropriate. In this category we can also include the faithful receiving the Eucharist inappropriately.

Moreover, there are some seasons in the Liturgical Calendar in which a particular community adapts some of these liturgical changes to bring more meaning for the liturgical time of the year. These changes must have the approval of the pastor. For example, during the Lenten season our parish was practicing reverent silence at the end of every Sunday Mass meaning that a final Hymn was not sang. Also, during Lent, we invited every person in the pews to kneel during the Lamb of God. We know that there are people with special needs or people that cannot kneel; In this case they are not obliged to kneel. Furthermore, the liturgy and the purpose of movements is to lead the whole community into prayer. The flow of the liturgy is not to be affected by our movements as they only add in some cases to the reverence that we should show for the Eucharist. There are many other details about our liturgy that I am not addressing in this article and should be discussed in a later time. To end I would like to encourage our beloved community to write to us (priests) an e-mail or to approach us for any specific question. Fr Henry and I will be more than glad to respond to your suggestions, concerns and questions.

### Operation Bienvenida

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope that by the grace of God you and your loved ones are doing well.

You have probably heard that the Diocese, in collaboration with Catholic Charities and the Valley Missionary Program at Our Lady of Soledad in Coachella, has been welcoming our brothers and sisters from Central America who are seeking asylum in the United States. Through this operation called **Operation Bienvenida**.

Here is a brief explanation of the process: The United States Border Patrol transports groups of migrants to the VMP facilities on a daily basis, typically in the late afternoon. On arrival they are welcomed by a priest and/ or a deacon , a nun and several volunteers and offer the opportunity to shower and enjoy a meal before going to bed. The next day, Catholic Charities begin asses individuals situations regarding destination, and helps buy bus tickets necessary for their travel.

As you can imagine, in keeping **Operations Bienvenida** going we need donations of Adult Clothing, Children's Clothing, Teenagers Clothing, Men's Pants, Underwear, Socks, Tennis shoes, T-shirts, Bras for Women, Toiletries as well as Money.
