TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our readings this week speak of God's promises and their fulfillment, all in different ways. Isaiah presents a feast set in the future and hosted by God. Here the participants witness the astonishing generosity of God. At the feast, God gives the ultimate gift, the destruction of death itself. Saint Paul, confident in the fulfillment of God's abundant promises, urges the Philippians to live in gratitude and patience. Today's Gospel, however, is more challenging for us to hear. While announcing God's generous invitation, Jesus also describes, in dramatic imagery, how people may reject the invitation. Matthew reminded the early church of the need to recognize God's summons and be prepared to participate fully in God's banquet. This complex and unsettling parable invites our reflection on the nature of God's invitation and our response.

A STARK CONTRAST

The parable in today's Gospel is like a political cartoon or graphic novel. It uses exaggerations and odd plot twists to convey its message. There is little attempt to be "realistic." Jesus compares the rejection of him by the chief priests and elders to an outrageous imaginary scene. To its audience, it would be deeply offensive that anyone summoned to a royal wedding banquet would violently reject the invitation. This would indicate a full revolt against the king. The parable was a blunt accusation against the religious leaders.

In comparison, the people found on the streets who go to the banquet are like those who accepted Jesus during his ministry. They are the "unimportant" people who are surprisingly receptive to him. Matthew draws a stark contrast to accuse the priests and elders and to uplift ordinary people who recognize the presence of God in Jesus.

RECEIVING GOD'S JOY

The final scene introduces the unacceptably dressed banquet guest. Matthew is concerned here about the full readiness of those who accept God's invitation. A superficial assent or participation is not enough. God wants our whole selves invested here.

Jesus' followers are to be prepared for the banquet, as suggested by the wedding garment. The meaning of the garment is not clearly explained. It's helpful to recall that a wedding banquet, then and now, is a profoundly joyous event. Being dressed appropriately means being ready to celebrate. Our hearts must be ready to receive God's joy.

Indeed, it can be difficult to be receptive to joy when we have been hurt in many ways during our lives. Our pain may cause us into close up, pulling away from others and away from God. It helps to remember that our God overflows with joy and is eager to share the fullness of joy with us. In our times of suffering, God actively invites us to receive this joy, and in turn to share it with others.

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Nuestras lecturas de esta semana hablan de las promesas de Dios y de su cumplimiento, todo de maneras diferentes. Isaías presenta una fiesta ambientada en el futuro y organizada por Dios. Aquí los participantes son testigos de la asombrosa generosidad de Dios. En la fiesta, Dios da el don supremo, la destrucción de la muerte misma. San Pablo, confiado en el cumplimiento de las abundantes promesas de Dios, insta a los filipenses a vivir con gratitud y paciencia. Sin embargo, el Evangelio de hoy es más difícil para nosotros. Al anunciar la generosa invitación de Dios, Jesús también describe, en imágenes dramáticas, cómo la gente puede rechazar la invitación. Mateo recordó a la iglesia primitiva la necesidad de reconocer la llamada de Dios y estar preparado para participar plenamente en el banquete de Dios. Esta compleja e inquietante parábola invita a reflexionar sobre la naturaleza de la invitación de Dios y nuestra respuesta.

UN FUERTE CONTRASTE

La parábola de hoy en el Evangelio es como una caricatura política o novela gráfica. Utiliza exageraciones y extraños giros de la historia para transmitir su mensaje. Hay una poca intensión de ser “realista”. Jesús compara el rechazo hacia él por parte del sumo sacerdote y los ancianos a una escena imaginaria escandalosa. Para su audiencia, hubiera sido profundamente ofensivo que alguien asistiera a un banquete real y luego violentamente rechazara la invitación. Esto indicaría una rebelión total en contra del rey. La parábola fue una acusación contundente en contra de los líderes religiosos.

En comparación, las personas encontradas en la calle que iban al banquete eran como aquellas que aceptaron a Jesús durante su ministerio. Ellos son las personas “sin importancia” que sorpresivamente son receptivas hacia él. Mateo marca un fuerte contraste para acusar a los sacerdotes y ancianos y elevar a las personas ordinarias que reconocen la presencia de Dios en Jesús.

RECIBIENDO LA ALEGRÍA DE DIOS

La escena final presenta al invitado que está vestido de manera inapropiada para el banquete. Mateo está interesado en una lectura completa de aquellos que acepta la invitación de Dios. Un consentimiento superficial o participación no es suficiente. Dios quiere todo nuestro ser dedicado aquí.

Los seguidores de Jesús deben prepararse para el banquete, como sugiere una ocasión de boda. El significado de la boda no está claramente explicado. Ayuda a recordar que una boda, entonces y ahora, es un evento de profunda alegría. Estar vestidos apropiadamente significa estar listos para celebrar. Nuestros corazones deben estar listos para recibir la alegría de Dios.

En efecto, puede ser difícil ser receptivo a la alegría cuando hemos sido lastimados en muchas maneras durante nuestra vida. Nuestro dolor puede causar que nos cerremos, que nos alejemos de otras personas y de Dios. Es de ayuda recordar que nuestro Dios abunda de alegría y está ansioso de compartir la plena alegría con nosotros. En nuestro tiempo de sufrimiento, Dios activamente nos invita a recibir esta alegría, y a cambio compartirla con los demás.




“Fratelli tutti”: a call to disrupt our lives and pay attention to the world

Fratelli tutti is “a devastating challenge to our ecological, political, economic and social life”, but above all, it is the “proclamation of an ineradicable, joyful truth, presented as a well-spring for a fatigued world.”

This is according to Professor Anna Rowlands, a renowned political theologian and member of the panel that presented Pope Francis’ third Encyclical in the Vatican’s new Synod Hall on Sunday. Speaking to Vatican Radio’s Christopher Wells, Professor Rowlands said *Fratelli tutti*, with its powerful social meditation on the Good Samaritan, who recognizes love and attention as the preeminent law and model for creative social friendship, is a call to everyone to take action. “I think that the core of this document is a call for us to stop and find a way to look at the world in a different way,” Prof. Rowlands said, noting that **Pope Francis is asking us to stop looking at the world with the eyes of indifference or cynicism.** He is asking us, she explained, “**to stop and to begin to look again.**”

A call for social action

Rowlands said the document contains a list of social actions, the first being the command that we “pay attention to the world around us, to what truly is.” Pope Francis, she continued sees reality and tells us that the only true perception of that reality is through encounter with “**the reality of all the people and of the created order.**” “His first call to us is simply to pay attention, to be with what is, and what is both the suffering and the difficulty of the world, but also its beauty and its grace,” she said.

She noted that he finds a contemplative starting point for his social teaching in his deep association with Saint Francis of Assisi, and that this is imbued in a political mysticism. **Church’s social teaching rooted in reality** Rowlands recalled that all the social teaching documents from 1891 onwards stem from a meditation by the respective Pope on the world, and on the action of the world. “*Rerum Novarum* was inspired by the action of local bishops in Germany and in the UK involved in the dockworkers strike and in industrial relations. Later documents were also inspired by movements on the ground, often ecclesial movements,” she explained.

Pope Francis, she added, is very clear that this encyclical was inspired by an interfaith dialogue and by visits and encounters he has had all over the world. So, she continued, **it begins with his engagement with a world of action and then moves into a reflective phase in which “the Pope gathers, reflects, prays, discerns and then presents this reflective response to reality.”** He does this in the hope of impelling a kind of revolution, a change of dynamics that will lead to action towards the common good. “I think that what he imagines really is this world which is based on a cycle of constant meditation and action, contemplation and action,” she said. This vision is at the heart of monastic life, it is what Bishops in the wider episcopal community are meant to do, and most certainly, it is at the heart of the task of the Bishop of Rome.

The call for a concrete response

In *Fratelli tutti*, Rowlands said, Pope Francis calls for a concrete response from all people of goodwill, regardless of their religious belonging. He does so using the parable of the Good Samaritan, because it is “utterly concrete, utterly practical, utterly immediate and utterly devastating in terms of what it means for an individual.” He’s asking us, she explained, “to be interrupted in the flow of our everyday lives; to stop and pay attention to those whom he describes as ‘foreign in our own neighborhoods’, and he doesn’t just literally mean coming from a foreign place, he means the divisions of wealth and poverty in a street, in a neighborhood, in a city.” He wants us, she continued, to think about the roles that we occupy in our professional lives “and he has a lot to say about the vocation of those in politics, of those in business etc.” Rowlands noted that the Pope also talks about the role of grass-root movements and of the importance of building a new world together with those who are most marginalized and excluded, not “for them or on their behalf.” **This is an action, she said, that requires us to build relationships in every stratum of our everyday lives. He, Pope Francis, believes that the transformation of the world will stem from that basis, but it is essential that we let ourselves be disrupted and disturbed in our normal routines, “to learn that pattern of attention and the gifts it brings.”**

Social friendship

Finally, Rowlands reflected on the meaning for Pope Francis of social friendship. **She expressed her belief that according to his conception of universal fraternity that envisages a world in which we are all interconnected, brothers and sisters and children of the same God,** and said that ‘social friendship’ is the concrete response to that realization. It’s a vision, she concluded, that leads to a structural commitment, “**to forms of action together in the world**”. So, “social friendship is the set of practices that allow us to realize universal friendship as a way of life, as a habit.”






