CONSEQUENCES

Actions have consequences. As children, we were often told that if we would do something, then we would receive a present or a reward. If we didn't, it might result in a punishment. Geometry also uses the "If-Then Statement." That is what our scriptures are like this Sunday. In each reading, there is a suggested action on our part, which will result in a desired outcome. There is a feminine personification of God as Wisdom, Psalm 63 and the intimate thirsting for God, the letter to the Thessalonians on believing in Christ, and Matthew's parable of the wise and foolish virgins. In the world of instant everything, we are not good about being patient, and our follow-through can be terrible. But each reading in its own way promises us that if we diligently seek God, we will be blessed and rewarded, and that it is worth the work and the wait!

KEEP YOUR LAMPS

In the old spiritual, "Keep Your Lamps Trimmed and Burning" we hear the imperative to wait and be ready, and while there are many variations, it usually ends "The world is nearly done." "The time is drawing near." or "The day is dawning nigh." The liturgical year is near its end, and we begin to feel that tension of "already but not yet" as the readings become more eschatological (about the end-times) in nature. We are called to wait patiently. Yet, like the wise and foolish virgins, we run the risk of falling asleep, and or running out of oil. Waiting for God, preparing for God, requires much hope, much preparation and discipline, and at times it is counter-intuitive. We must put aside impatience or the desire for immediate gratification and keep the end in sight. In running terms, it is not a sprint, but a marathon.

TRIMMED AND BURNING

So how do we do this? Whether we are sitting in the pew or one of those involved more intimately in liturgical ministry, this is a call for spiritual self-maintenance. None of our scriptures today is passive. Seeking and waiting for God requires work. Presence and participation in the liturgy are among the easiest and most natural ways to provide fuel for our spiritual lamps. But like a car, we need to do more than just put in gasoline. There are other needs to attend to for upkeep. Just read the opportunities in this bulletin! Perhaps you may want to attend a parish scripture class or find a spiritual book to read. Sign up online to receive the daily readings or some sort of daily reflection. Find a spiritual podcast to listen to on your commute home from work or turn off the news and music and drive in morning silence. Share simple, regular prayer times as a family such as at meals and bedtime. Experience the sacrament of Reconciliation. Or maybe you do too much, and the call is to let go of something. Do not become burned out or lose heart. Take courage and remember, "The day is drawing nigh!" Amen.

CONSECUENCIAS

Las acciones tienen consecuencias. Cuando éramos niños, a menudo se nos decía que si hacíamos algo, entonces recibiríamos un regalo o una recompensa. Si no lo hiciéramos, podría resultar en un castigo. La geometría también utiliza la “instrucción If-Then.” Así son nuestras Escrituras este domingo. En cada lectura, hay una acción sugerida por nuestra parte, que resultará en un resultado deseado. Hay una personificación femenina de Dios como Sabiduría, Salmo 63 y la sed íntima de Dios, la carta a los Tesalonicenses sobre creer en Cristo, y la parábola de Mateo de las vírgenes sabias e insensatas. En el mundo de todo en el instante, no somos buenos para ser pacientes, y nuestro seguimiento puede ser terrible. Pero cada lectura a su manera nos promete que si buscamos diligentemente a Dios, seremos bendecidos y recompensados, y que vale la pena la obra y la espera!

MANTÉN LAS MECHAS AJUSTADAS

En la antigua frase “mantén las mechas ajustadas y encendidas de tu lámpara”, escuchamos de manera urgente esperar y estar listos, y aunque hay otras formas de decir esa frase, por lo general concluye así: “el mundo está por terminar”, “el tiempo se acerca” o “el amanecer del día se aproxima”. El fin del año litúrgico casi está por terminar y empezamos a sentir el nerviosismo de “ya pero todavía no” a medida que las lecturas se vuelven más escatológicas (sobre el fin de los tiempos) en su esencia. Se nos llama a esperar pacientemente. Sin embargo, como las vírgenes sabias e imprudentes, corremos el riesgo de quedarnos dormidos o de quedarnos sin aceite. Esperar a Dios, prepararse para Dios, requiere mucha esperanza, mucha preparación y disciplina, y a veces es en contra del sentido común. Debemos dejar a un lado la impaciencia o el deseo de satisfacción inmediata y tener el final a la vista. En términos de una competencia de carreras, no es una carrera corta, sino un maratón.

ENCENDIDAS DE TU LÁMPARA

Entonces, ¿cómo hacemos esto? Ya sea que estemos sentados en las bancas o seamos alguien que participa activamente en alguno de los apostolados o ministerios litúrgicos, esto es un llamado al auto mantenimiento espiritual. Ninguna de nuestras Escrituras de hoy es pasiva. Buscar y esperar a Dios requiere trabajo. La presencia y participación en la liturgia son una de las formas más fáciles y naturales de proporcionar combustible a nuestras lámparas espirituales. Pero al igual que en el automóvil, necesitamos hacer algo más que poner gasolina. Hay otras necesidades que atender para el mantenimiento. ¡Lea este boletín y encontrará algunas oportunidades! Tal vez quieras asistir a una clase de Biblia o buscar y leer un libro espiritual. Inscríbete a algún sitio en Internet para recibir diariamente una reflexión o las lecturas del día. Busca un podcast espiritual para que lo escuches mientras vas de camino de regreso del trabajo a casa o maneja en silencio y apaga el radio con noticias o música. Comparte en familia momentos de oración sencillos y regulares, como en las comidas y a la hora de acostarte. Acude al Sacramento de la Reconciliación; o tal vez, haces demasiado, y la llamada es dejar de hacer algo. No te fatigues o desanimes. Ten valor y recuerda, “el día se acerca”. Amén.

Pope Francis Advent Homily; focus on St. Joseph and his silent obedience

Vatican News Release: In the homily at the morning Mass, Pope Francis said Saint Joseph “took up” the fatherhood of Jesus, “a paternity that was not his own, but God’s.” In difficulties, in troubles, in darkness, we learn from St Joseph who knew “how to walk in darkness,” “how to listen to the voice of God,” “how to go forward in silence.” That was Pope Francis’ reflection during the morning Mass at the Casa Santa Marta, commenting on the day’s Gospel. Jesus, he explained, was born of Mary, the spouse of Joseph, the son of David.

Joseph believed and obeyed

The Pope reflected on the emotions felt by Joseph when the signs of Mary’s pregnancy appeared after she returned from the house of Elizabeth: He spoke of his “doubts,” his “sorrow,” of his “suffering,” while all around him people began to murmur – the “gossip of the neighborhood.” He “did not understand,” but he knew that Mary was “a woman of God”: and so, he decided “to send her away quietly,” not accusing her publicly. Such was his intention until “the Lord intervened,” through an angel, in a dream, who explained how the child had been conceived in her through the Holy Spirit. And so “he believed and obeyed”:

“Joseph fought within himself; in that struggle, the voice of God [is heard]: ‘But get up’ — that ‘Get up’ [which is heard] so many times in the Bible at the beginning of a mission — ‘Take Mary, bring her to your home. Take charge of the situation; take this situation in hand and go forward.’ Joseph didn’t go to his friends be comforted; he didn’t go to a psychiatrist so that he could interpret the dream. No... He believed. And he went forward. He took the situation in hand. But what must you take in hand, Joseph? What was the situation? What was it that Joseph had to take up? Two things: fatherhood, and mystery.”

Taking charge of the fatherhood

First, the Pope continued, Joseph had to take charge of the “fatherhood.” And this is already implied in the genealogy of Jesus, which explains how He “was thought to be the son of Joseph: “He took on a paternity that was not his own: it came from the Father. And he went ahead with that fatherhood and all it signified: not only supporting Mary and the Child, but also raising the Child, teaching Him his trade, bringing Him up to manhood. ‘Take up a paternity that is not yours, but God’s.” And this, without saying a word. In the Gospel, there is not a single word spoken by Joseph. A man of silence, of silent obedience.”

Taking in hand the mystery of leading people back to God

Joseph is also the man who “takes in hand” the mystery. The first Mystery explains that it is the mystery of “bringing the people back to God,” the mystery of the re-Creation — which, as the liturgy tells us, is “even more wondrous” than the first. “Joseph took in hand this mystery and help: with silence, with his work, up to the moment when God called him to Himself. It is said of this man, who took up the fatherhood and the mystery, that he was the shadow of the Father: the shadow of God the Father. And if the man Jesus learned to say ‘daddy,’ ‘father,’ to His Father Who He knew as God, He learned it from life, from the witness of Joseph, the man who guarded [Him], the man who raised [Him], the man who carried forward every paternity and every mystery, but took nothing for himself.” This, Pope Francis said, is “the great Joseph,” who God needed to carry forward “the mystery of leading the people anew to the new Creation
