



IN ORDINARY TIME

January 16, 2022

BROKEN SILENCE

"For Pete's sake will you kids be quiet?" This question, no doubt, has passed the lips of numerous parents through the years. It's tempting to speculate as to who, exactly, was instructing Isaiah to be quiet. Neighbors? Fellow prophets? Family? No matter. Isaiah says firmly that for the sake of Jerusalem and Zion he will not be silent. Conversely, in the familiar passage in today's Gospel reading, Mary chides her son to break his silence, to save the wedding soon to run out of wine. Jesus responds with a prophetic action, one that signals the miraculous, bountiful joy flowing at the heavenly wedding feast. Prophetic words, prophetic deeds—both flow from a broken silence.

PROBLEM CHILDREN

The Corinthians seem to have been Paul's problem children. His two letters to them are much longer than any of his other letters—two, three, or four times as long as some. It seems that if the early Christians at Corinth could misunderstand or do something wrong, they would. Fortunately for us, the two letters to the Corinthians, though they contain much didactic or instructional material, also provide some of Paul's most well-crafted and grace-filled writing. This is certainly true today, with Paul's litany of gifts that the Spirit bestows on the faithful, even to this day. Paul seeks to calm the squabbling that seems to have been going on, as the Corinthians tried to claim one gift or another as more important. All gifts come from the same Spirit, Paul reminds them; and the various gifts are given for the benefit of the community. When jealousy arises in our midst today, we can still turn to Paul's insights so we might stop being prideful, problem children.

WONDROUS CHILD

In the Gospel scene at Cana, we see Mary turning to her own child, Jesus. Perhaps she recalled the power of the Spirit that had flowed in her womb at his Incarnation, leading her to discern that surely he must have Spirit-given gifts that could help with the impending crisis at the wedding. As at her Annunciation, she may not have been completely certain, at first, exactly how this would come about, but in faith at Cana she turned to Jesus. In faith, her words, "do whatever he tells you," echoed her reply to Gabriel: "Let it be done to me as you say." In faith, she knows whatever words the Word will speak are bound to bring another inbreaking of the Spirit, another mani-

festation of God's reign. And she is right. Her wondrous child, John the Evangelist tells us, performed his first wonder there, and signaled the presence of the divine in the everyday.







CALL ME OUT!

In Matthew 14:22–33, Peter calls out to Jesus who was walking on the water while he sat in the boat, Peter then tested Jesus by asking Him to prove it was Him telling Jesus to command him to meet Jesus on the water. But he fell. Why did he fall? Peter became frightened and took his eyes off Jesus. He worried about his surroundings. How many of us can relate to losing focus on Jesus, especially during the past year when everything seems more difficult because of the pandemic.

COVID-19 has been so challenging for everybody on many different levels, from job duties changing, learning environments going remote, job loss, and some dealing with death and illness due to the pandemic. Jesus is always going to be there for us through the most difficult moments of our life even when we cannot see or feel him. We need to remember this is when he is with us the most.

Master of Ceremonies Ministry Be Part of the Team

The primary role of the Master of Ceremonies (MC) is to assist in organizing the Mass and directing all liturgical movement so it flows with the proper decorum. This is a vibrant, exciting and rewarding ministry. MC's commit to a minimum of one weekend Mass per month and an occasional meeting or weeknight Mass for special celebrations or feast days. MC's are required to have organizational skills, be able to give and take directions and work well with children (Altar Servers).

In our parish the Master of Ceremonies is responsible for the proper and smooth conduct of the various liturgical ceremonies such as the Solemn Mass, Triduum observances etc. We train on how to prepare the sanctuary and altar, instruct the altar servers in the liturgy, coordinate with the music director, ushers and EMHC and others involved in the liturgy. The objective is to relieve the celebrant from having to concern himself with the logistics of the ceremony and to allow him to focus on the sacramental aspects of the Mass

The Baptism of Jesus: Its Message for Us Today

The Baptism of Jesus is the second moment in the whole event of the Epiphany (cf. <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>, 528; <u>Epiphany</u>: Its Meaning and Practice Today, SP&SP Parish Bulletin, January 8-9, 2022). In the New Testament, only the Synoptic gospels relate the story of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. Mark 1:9-11; Matt 3:13-17 and Luke 3:21-22 have stories that are different from each other. John has none.

Mark 1:9-11 is probably the oldest tradition concerning the baptism of Jesus which Matt and Luke adopted. The voice from heaven, common to all synoptic accounts, claimed Jesus as "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well

pleased". This claim from heaven brings back to memory Is 42:1 which says: "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased. Upon whom I have put my spirit; he shall bring forth justice to the nations." This is remarkable: the second birth of Jesus, where his true father is introduced and who claims him to be his real son. In baptism, we receive our new birth as beloved children of our loving God.

John the Baptist earlier said that Jesus would baptize with the Holy Spirit (Mark 1:8b) to distinguish his baptism from that of Jesus. John baptized with water (Mark 1:8a). Matt and Luke, however, would share the same tradition of Jesus' baptism: a baptism with the Holy Spirit and fire (Matt 3:11c; Luke 3:16c). The baptism of John called for repentance and forgiveness, the past of our lives (water that cleanses); the baptism of Jesus cleanses AND brings new life, new vigor and judgment as well, the present and future of our lives (Holy Spirit and fire). In baptism, we are renewed as persons and we are called to form this new community of new life, of new vigor and of a new sense of judgment.

In the spirit of Is 42:1, Jesus receives a mission concomitant to the claim that he is God's beloved son. This identity brings with it the essential and intrinsic element of the mission of justice. This is the mission of justice, God's justice, that springs from love, God's way of loving. Just as the servant of long ago suffered for the cause of justice that arose from the loving, compassionate and forgiving God, so too Jesus, the Son and Suffering Servant of God, would also suffer and die for the sake of love, for the cause of justice of a merciful and forgiving God. In baptism, we are called to the mission of administering the justice of God, even if we have to suffer and die in the process. Our mission is not to kill the enemy in order to defend ourselves in the name of justice. That is the Old Testament way of carrying out human justice. On the contrary, we are "reborn from above" in the New Testament times, with this extraordinary new life that participates in the life of Jesus, Son of God.

We listen to the voice from heaven. We listen to the voice of Jesus. We listen to each other very profoundly from the heart, from our loving heart. Because the voice from heaven is in our hearts too. Because the voice of Jesus is in our hearts too. Because the Holy Spirit is in our hearts. If we only open our hearts to the presence of the Holy Spirit that gives new life. To the fire that burns and cleanses and purifies our hearts. The scene of Jesus going into the water and coming out of the water evokes the memory of the Exodus. In the baptism of Jesus a New Exodus is taking place. A new liberation is happening, more profound than the old one. The old exodus was a liberation from the oppression and injustice of Egypt into the Promised Land flowing with mild and honey. This New Exodus deepens this sense of liberation from oppression and injustice. This is a new liberation from sin and death, the ultimate enemy of life. Sin brings about death. Forgiveness of sin brings about resurrection and eternal life. Thus, this New Exodus is a new experience of New Life of New Liberation and Salvation! We are the New Humanity that must live and maintain and develop this New Life of Liberation – Salvation.

Luke added a new dimension to this New Exodus of Liberation-Salvation. Jesus was praying when the heaven was opened. Prayer opens up heaven for the suppliants on earth! Prayer unites heaven and earth. Prayer raises and brings the needs of humanity and creation to heaven; heaven opens up to receive them by sending down the Son to the earth! It is through the Son on earth that the prayer addressed to heaven is fulfilled. When heaven opens to send the Son of God to the earth. This is only possible because of the Holy Spirit and fire that are the gifts to humanity and creation below from the Father and the Son from heaven above. The action of heaven is here on earth!

This prayer is in function of love. Jesus prayed to the Father in an encounter of mutual intimacy and love. A heart to heart conversation with each other. For the sake of the people and creation on earth! That is why our prayer must also be in function of love. Love of God and love for each other. A disinterested love. Not love for oneself, that one can go to heaven alone because of an imaginary one-to-one relationship with the Father. An interested love. In this second moment of the Epiphany of our Lord, let us rejoice in our baptism in Jesus Christ, in our new way of living and loving, in justice and mercy and peace. Let us pray for each other and take good care of each other with the tenderness and suffering of Jesus, with the strength and firmness of the Holy Spirit, with that fire that cleanses, purifies and makes us shine. Behold, God makes all things new! Happy Prosperous and Liberating 2022 to us all.
