



COMMUNITY

Community is important. Community is essential. Community is crucial. This message is the foundation of today's readings from Nehemiah, Corinthians, and Luke. Ezra's reading of the scroll is done in front of the community, including—a radical act at the time—women, and children old enough to understand, groups usually not counted among those hearing God's promise proclaimed. Community is important. The mystical Body of Christ, like the human body, functions best and most fully when all members are playing the role for which they were meant. Community is essential. God's word is fulfilled when the community has heard it, and witnessed it. In Luke, the baptism and desert trials of Jesus lead to the synagogue scene, which will then lead Jesus to his public ministry of proclaiming the reign of God. He eventually will journey to Jerusalem and his crucifixion. Community is crucial.

ONE BODY, ONE JESUS

Our liturgical calendar separates different Gospel scenes, which can sometimes do them a bit of a disservice. The liturgical year, of course, has its own rhythm and purpose, into which the stories of the life of Jesus are placed. However, when Luke was organizing his Gospel (for "Theophilus" the lover of God whom we encounter in today's Gospel introduction), today's scene was part of a three-fold structure: the baptism of Jesus; the temptation in the desert; the announcement of the public mission in the synagogue at Nazareth. Linking these is the Holy Spirit, who descended on the body of Jesus at his baptism, who filled his body as he endured his forty-day trial, and who is upon his body to announce and to bring about God's reign, a mission he fulfills with his body on the cross. The incarnation (the "in-flesh-ing") of Jesus, which we think of in connection with his birth, remains central to his story.

ONE CHRIST, ONE BODY

Last week's reading from Corinthians concerned the one Spirit who gives many gifts, yet is the source of our unity. Paul continues this theme today using the image of the body, whose different members each have an important and distinct role to play. The Spirit of baptism forms that one mystical Body of Christ. The Spirit of baptism fills the many members, but unites them always as one. The Spirit of baptism is on each member, as it was for Jesus in the synagogue at Nazareth. That Spirit of our baptism anoints each of us as a member of Christ's Body to be glad tidings, proclaim liberty,

bring clearer vision, lift the oppressed, to announce God's reign to all. As different members of Christ's Body, we are each called upon to do this in our own way. We may face opposition or rejection, as Jesus did, but we can always turn again in faith to the Spirit of our baptism who is still with us.





Parish Mission Statement



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



ST. PETER AND ST. PAUL

Life, that is what all of us want. We want to live. We as human beings always strive to preserve our lives, but why? It is something that we should think about. Our desire to live is at the center of our hearts, and it is a beautifully designed desire that God created. Brother and sisters, Our Lord wants us to live, and live to the fullest! He is explaining to us that he does not like death; he does not like it when we die because of sin. It is important to remember that in this life we have the freedom to choose between the good and the evil, between what is beautiful and what is ugly, between love and indifference. The Church invites us to be transformed and renewed, to let God purify us and to become better disciples of Him. Our Lord is clear in the Gospel, on how He is asking us, His disciples, to be better than the Pharisees! But what does He mean by that? Remember that the Pharisees became disciples of the law, and not disciples of God: they became rigorous in trying to fulfill the law given by

God through Moses. However, they didn't trust or ask God for help; rather, they became blind because of their pride, and they forgot the essential part of the law, which is love of God and neighbor.

This is why Jesus was harsh when he spoke about them, because He is making a point: without being humble and trusting in Him, we will not be able to enter into His Kingdom, without asking Him to forgive us for all our sins, even venial sins, we cannot be truly disciples of Him. Yes, we know venial sins are not deadly, but even though they do not separate us from God, they make a wound, a wound that needs to be healed, only by His grace and mercy.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, we should always bow down before our Lord and ask Him to forgive our imperfections, our sins; we have to ask Him to give us the grace of becoming saints, because nothing is impossible for God! As St. Augustine says, "There is no saint without a past, and not sinner without a future." Therefore, let's trust in Him. Do not be scared. Instead, let us put our faith in God, hoping that we can one day be in His kingdom.


Master of Ceremonies Ministry

Be Part of the Team

The primary role of the Master of Ceremonies (MC) is to assist in organizing the Mass and directing all liturgical movement so it flows with the proper decorum. This is a vibrant, exciting and rewarding ministry. MC's commit to a minimum of one weekend Mass per month and an occasional meeting or weeknight Mass for special celebrations or feast days. MC's are required to have organizational skills, be able to give and take directions and work well with children (Altar Servers).

In our parish the Master of Ceremonies is responsible for the proper and smooth conduct of the various liturgical ceremonies such as the Solemn Mass, Triduum observances etc. We train on how to prepare the sanctuary and altar, instruct the altar servers in the liturgy, coordinate with the music director, ushers and EMHC and others involved in the liturgy. The objective is to relieve the celebrant from having to concern himself with the logistics of the ceremony and to allow him to focus on the sacramental aspects of the Mass

The Third Moment of the Epiphany: *The Wedding at Cana: The Inauguration of the New Time*

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 528 says: "The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee."

Today, we reflect on the 3rd moment of the Epiphany of our Lord: The Wedding at Cana.

At first glance, we see here a miraculous event: the water turned into wine. But a deeper reading of the text would show certain strange things going on: Mary, the mother of Jesus is not called by name. In fact, she is never called Mary, by name, in the whole Gospel of John. The evangelist prefers to call her "Woman", putting this appellation into the mouth of Jesus. Or "mother of Jesus". It seems that there were two invitations extended earlier by the newly wedded couple: one for the mother of Jesus, and the other, for Jesus and his disciples. That is why they are mentioned separately, now in an equal level: the mother of Jesus on her own, and Jesus and his disciples together as a separate entity. When wine runs out, the mother of Jesus comes to the rescue. She tells her son: they have no more wine. Jesus replies: What has it got to do with us, woman? My hour has not yet come. The mother is provoking her son to be concerned with the possible embarrassment of the new couple. The son responds: should it concern us that they have no more wine? Should his hour start now? This is the inauguration of "the hour" of service, of sacrifice and of glory (John 12:23-28).

The mother knows that her son will never refuse her. So she told the waiters: Do as he tells you. And, indeed, Jesus instructs them to fill the jars with water. And to serve it. The best wine has come last, contrary to the traditional practice of serving it first. Traditionally, good wine is served first so that when people would get already drunk, an inferior wine can be served without their noticing the difference. With the water for purification turned into wine, the external rites of purification are not needed anymore. No one knows where the best wine came from but the mother of Jesus and the servers: only those who serve in faith and obedience to Jesus know where the blessings come from. Jesus is the origin of these blessings.

Here at the wedding feast in Cana Jesus manifests his glory. For John the evangelist, Jesus is the real bridegroom who serves the best wine to his guests. The mother of Jesus, the woman, has replaced the old woman and old mother of the old time of the old creation and of the old humanity. She is indispensable in the unfolding story of salvation: without her, no miracle could ever happen. She will be there in the fullness of the miracle of love that dares to suffer and die for the sake of forgiveness and the new life it brings on the cross. The new wine is the new drink of the new celebration of the new wedding feast of the new Kingdom of God. The Wedding at Cana, more than just a miracle, inaugurates the New Creation, the New Time of Salvation, the In-breaking of the Kingdom of God, the New Wedding Feast of the New Humanity and New Creation and the New Bridegroom. Jesus the savior manifest himself as the true bridegroom of humanity, of all creation, of the Church. Only people of faith, of obedience and of love can see this happening!

Having presented himself and manifested his glory at Cana, Jesus will now go to Capharnaum with his disciples and with his mother: a new community of faith with a mission to continue building the newly inaugurated Reign of God.

This is the new community of the new time: a community of faith and love, of hope and dreams, of faithful sacrifice and humble service. For ourselves today, let us be a community married to Christ, gifted by the Holy Spirit, participating in the creative love of the Father! Let us be a community, inspired by Martin Luther King, Jr. who dared to follow Jesus. A new community that dares to dream something that is truly new, truly grand and truly beautiful. A new community that dares to commit to the dream of Jesus, that dares to struggle to make the dream of Jesus for us, the Reign of the God, come true. In our audacity to struggle for the kingdom, Jesus is made manifest, and we become the Epiphany of Jesus in our time.


