



FULFILLED IN YOUR HEARING

The "fulfilled in your hearing" statement of Jesus today is also the conclusion of last week's Gospel, with the words of Isaiah about the breadth of God's mercy and justice at its heart. The response of the crowd in the synagogue is united: *all* are amazed, but *all* likewise ask if he's not merely the son of Joseph the humble carpenter. Jesus calls them out for seeming to think that he ought to be doing his ministry only locally, and—selfishly—only for them. (After all, they know where he comes from!) When Jesus essentially replies "nope" through some proverbs and prophetic stories, *all* the crowd gets angry at his implication that the fulfillment in Jesus is for everyone, not just for them. When our "take care of your own" reflex kicks in, we would do well to recall that this isn't the attitude of Jesus, nor is it the attitude of his mission that we continue to this day.

YOU'VE BEEN WARNED

The opening of the reading selected from Jeremiah is surely one of the most comforting in scripture. Imagine! God knew me before my bodily conception; God dedicated me before my birth or any human dedication rites; God appointed me a prophet! Then comes the uh-oh. Jeremiah is warned that his appointment as a prophet will bring opposition, against which God's prophets must stand up. Somehow the appointment as God's prophet seems like it should be a bit happier, with the glamor that we might think will come from having friends in high places. Yet, just as there are many forces in the world arrayed against the divine will and divine goodness, so too are they arrayed against God's prophets. A second round of assurances comes to Jeremiah, a pledge that God will be with Jeremiah to strengthen him. God doesn't promise a turmoil-free life, but does vow to be Jeremiah's strength.

JESUS, SON OF JEREMIAH

In the synagogue at Nazareth, a similar turn of events takes place. When Jesus speaks of the Spirit's anointing being upon him, the anointing described in Isaiah, the crowd is amazed, and seems like they even want to take credit, since he's a local boy. Then Jesus speaks some words of tough love, and "local boy" pivots to "who does he think he is?" You couldn't blame Jesus, in that moment, if he recalled the words of Jeremiah, his prophetic ancestor. Though the crowd drove Jesus out of town and up a hill to throw him to his death, his time had not yet come. The strength and protection that

God promises to prophets came for Jesus that day, as he passed through the mob's midst, unharmed. He passed through their midst to continue the work for which the Spirit had anointed him. For us who follow the prophetic heritage of Jesus this day, we've been warned. But we've also been assured of God's care.

TODAY'S READINGS

Jeremiah 1:4–5, 17–19 Psalm 71:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 15–17 1 Corinthians 12:31 — 13:13 [13:4–13] Luke 4:21–30



The Third Moment of the Epiphany: The Wedding at Cana: The Inauguration of the New Time

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 528 says: "The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee."

Today, we reflect on the 3rd moment of the Epiphany of our Lord: The Wedding at Cana.

At first glance, we see here a miraculous event: the water turned into wine. But a deeper reading of the text would show certain strange things going on: Mary, the mother of Jesus is not called by name. In fact, she is never called Mary, by name, in the whole Gospel of John. The evangelist prefers to call her "Woman", putting this appellation into the mouth of Jesus. Or "mother of Jesus". It seems that there were two invitations extended earlier by the newly wedded couple: one for the mother of Jesus, and the other, for Jesus and his disciples. That is why they are mentioned separately, now in an equal level: the mother of Jesus on her own, and Jesus and his disciples together as a separate entity. When wine runs out, the mother of Jesus comes to the rescue. She tells her son: they have no more wine. Jesus replies: What has it got to do with us, woman? My hour has not yet come. The mother is provoking her son to be concerned with the possible embarrassment of the new couple. The son responds: should it concern us that they have no more wine? Should his hour start now? This is the inauguration of "the hour" of service, of sacrifice and of glory (John 12:23-28).


The mother knows that her son will never refuse her. So she told the waiters: Do as he tells you. And, indeed, Jesus instructs them to fill the jars with water. And to serve it. The best wine has come last, contrary to the traditional practice of serving it first. Traditionally, good wine is served first so that when people would get already drunk, an inferior wine can be served without their noticing the difference. With the water for purification turned into wine, the external rites of purification are not needed anymore. No one knows where the best wine came from but the mother of Jesus and the servers: only those who serve in faith and obedience to Jesus know where the blessings come from. Jesus is the origin of these blessings.

Here at the wedding feast in Cana Jesus manifests his glory. For John the evangelist, Jesus is the real bridegroom who serves the best wine to his guests. The mother of Jesus, the woman, has replaced the old woman and old mother of the old time of the old creation and of the old humanity. She is

indispensable in the unfolding story of salvation: without her, no miracle could ever happen. She will be there in the fullness of the miracle of love that dares to suffer and die for the sake of forgiveness and the new life it brings on the cross. The new wine is the new drink of the new celebration of the new wedding feast of the new Kingdom of God. The Wedding at Cana, more than just a miracle, inaugurates the New Creation, the New Time of Salvation, the In-breaking of the Kingdom of God, the New Wedding Feast of the New Humanity and New Creation and the New Bridegroom. Jesus the savior manifest himself as the true bridegroom of humanity, of all creation, of the Church. Only people of faith, of obedience and of love can see this happening!

Having presented himself and manifested his glory at Cana, Jesus will now go to Capharnaum with his disciples and with his mother: a new community of faith with a mission to continue building the newly inaugurated Reign of God.

This is the new community of the new time: a community of faith and love, of hope and dreams, of faithful sacrifice and humble service. For ourselves today, let us be a community married to Christ, gifted by the Holy Spirit, participating in the creative love of the Father! Let us be a community, inspired by Martin Luther King, Jr. who dared to follow Jesus. A new community that dares to dream something that is truly new, truly grand and truly beautiful. A new community that dares to commit to the dream of Jesus, that dares to struggle to make the dream of Jesus for us, the Reign of the God, come true. In our audacity to struggle for the kingdom, Jesus is made manifest, and we become the Epiphany of Jesus in our time.



Parish Mission Statement




