



BLESSINGS AND WOES

Today we hear once again of the deep connection between Jesus and Israel's prophets. In the reading from Jeremiah, God's curses at the opening are counterbalanced by God's blessings in the second part. In Luke's version of the Beatitudes, Jesus begins with blessings, then counterbalances with a "woe" section. The point is clear: the way we live our lives has a direct connection to whether we will experience curses and woes, or blessings instead. Of course, being among God's blessed ones (in Latin, *beati*, from which "beatitudes" comes) doesn't necessarily mean a life free of woe. Jesus, in his fully human nature, knew this. He also knew that when we seek happiness through our own devices, and trust only in ourselves, the woes are guaranteed to come. Let us follow the wisdom of Jeremiah and Jesus, along with the opening of the book of Psalms (echoed by Jeremiah today): "blessed are the ones who trust in the Lord."

I DON'T KNOW

There are times when the smartest, but most difficult, thing we can say is, "I don't know." While we often think of this as a sign of weakness, the amount of humility it takes to say this means that the word of God is alive and well in us. To say "I don't know" means that we look outside of ourselves to learn, and to find those who do know, and—ultimately—accept that we have to look to others and to God to help us, to guide us through life. To place our trust and hope only in this world, Paul tells the Corinthians (and us!), makes us people to be pitied. Jesus echoes this in the "woes" section of Luke's Beatitudes, when he points out that trusting in earthly wealth, full bellies, entertainments, and reputation will, eventually, not be enough when we are called beyond this life.

LOOK 'EM IN THE EYE

Prior to delivering the blessings and woes of his "Sermon on the Plain" in Luke, Jesus had been on top of a mountain in prayer, after which he selected the Twelve to go on his mission with him. Coming down from the mountain, the first thing Jesus does is show them what is at the heart of his—and their—mission: preaching to the multitude, healing all who were in need of it, no matter where they had come from. Luke then carefully notes that Jesus raises his eyes, not to look toward heaven again in prayer, but he raises his eyes to look directly at his disciples, to share the message of blessings and woes. This scene echoes Moses coming down from the mountain to give Israel

its command as to how they should live in God's covenant. As followers of Jesus today, we are called to live out his mission to the world, while we also look beyond this world to trust in God, our only hope.

TODAY'S READINGS

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Jer 17:5-8: Commentary:

The sins and punishment of Judah: Vv. 1-4: The denunciation of the sins of Judah and announcement of her deserved punishments. Both the denunciation and the announcement give rise to the curse directed at anyone who strays and departs from the Lord (v. 5-6), and blessings and benediction to one who remains firm, hoping always and trusting in the Lord (v. 7-8).

Second Reading: 1 Cor 15:12, 16-20

Commentary:

The resurrection of Jesus is ordered to ours; If ours is not given, then it was not given to Jesus either. Paul argues by reducing to absurdity the position of those who deny the resurrection. If Jesus did not rise, our faith lacks objectivity and foundation, our hope is illusory and a tragedy. The Apostle goes so far as to say that we Christians would be the most pitiable, having placed our hope in Christ "only for this life". A disaster for the dead and a great emptiness for the living. A vague immortality of the "soul" without the body, as proposed by Greek philosophy, is as repugnant to the Paul of the Jewish tradition as it is to the Christian Paul. This absurdity now exposed, Paul's argument then turns to the rationality of the resurrection of Jesus, the first of those who have fallen asleep.

Gospel: Lk 6:17, 20-26 Commentary:

Luke synthesizes the beatitudes in four aspects of human life: poverty, hunger, crying and persecution. Poverty, an anomalous situation, a state of life that is the fruit of injustice, is contrary to God's will. Therefore, when Jesus declares these poor blessed, it does not mean that they should feel happy about their situation, but because that poverty that God rejects has to disappear with the advent of the kingdom of God concretized in justice. One of the fundamental axes of Jesus' project is the proclamation (carrying out) of the year of the Lord's grace whose concrete meaning we find in the jubilee year. Now, if these words of Jesus, apart from being consoling for the poor, are also a project to be carried out, then the follower of Jesus is tasked to making that reign of God, translated into categories of justice, an effective reality, in order to be able to feel the joy of the presence of the kingdom.

Poverty, or rather impoverishment, brings serious consequences. First of all: hunger. Well then, the hungry are also happy because they will be satisfied. If the impoverished can dream of a better, fairer world, through the advent of the kingdom of God, hunger will also have to disappear, not in a magical way, but as a result of the commitment of all to realize that year of grace, one of whose ends is the social leveling due to the forgiveness of debts, the recovery of pawned goods and the return to their property and to the bosom of their families of all the enslaved. And this must be a permanent state (cf. Deut 15:1-11). The other consequence of impoverishment is tears, as a symbol of pain, marginalization, but also of impotence in the face of a reality that is increasingly cruel and tormenting for the impoverished. In this new order that the presence of the kingdom has to establish, tears have to be exchanged for happiness and joy. The struggle and the effort to achieve this new order of things which God wanted from of old and set by Jesus as the first and fundamental criterion that makes the reality of the kingdom possible, will not occur in a "peaceful" way. Not that Jesus is thinking of violent actions, but rather he wants to prevent his followers from the violent situations, the persecution and the pain that they will have to experience at the hands of those who are radically opposed to sharing the material and immaterial, cultural and spiritual goods that little by little they have snatched from the people and that they obstinately retain as exclusively their own. Almost always, if not always, the hoarders and supporters of the unjust order react with force, with violence, with defamation, imprisonment, if not with physical elimination, in many cases in our communities. Well, Jesus also calls those blessed because that persecution and that rejection is not gratuitous. It is the price that is paid for the struggle and the search for justice and equity.

Only those who experience these contradictions will be able to understand the joy of being in tune with the concern of the Father and of Jesus for justice.

Thus, we understand the woes directed at the rich and the consequences of being rich as a lamentation of Jesus, but a poetic lamentation, that is, as a warning or a reprimand that Jesus makes to the promoters and supporters of an absolutely unjust social order like the one lived by the people of his time and in general the people of all times when the goods of creation, the goods of culture, science and technology are absorbed by a few with the consequences that we all know: impoverishment of the great majority, hunger, pain and tears. With these woes Jesus denounces that petty attitude of those who have put the meaning of their life in possessions, in goods; of those who get fed up and still consume, ignoring the indigent; of those who enjoy and have a good time at the expense of others; of those who are the

object of flattering fame. But what is the meaning of a life that passes in this way? - Fr. Ben, MSC



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WHEN LOVE SEES YOU

I would like to share a song called "When Love Sees You" by Mac Powell. I came across this song a couple of years ago and when I heard it, I felt that there was a profound meaning that could help many people. There are many times when people want to belong. When we think about what belonging can mean, we can say acceptance as a member or part of something. It is a simple word for a vast concept. When we think of belonging, we can see it is a human need, just like food and shelter. Some find belonging in a church, some with friends, some with family, and some on Facebook or other social media. Even when people seek belonging with others, some may experience the opposite; they may feel loneliness and rejection. There are many reasons for this. Some reasons can be related to unresolved trauma, feelings of low self-worth, and results of unhealthy relationships.

Many often go through life carrying these wounds and have difficulty believing they belong and have love. This song talks to those who have had a bad experience by how people have treated them, by choices they have made in life, or just feeling rejection in general. The song gives different stories that we can find in the bible of people who were

feeling rejection in general. The song gives different stories that we can find in the bible of people who were rejected or not loved because of circumstances such as leprosy, blindness, deafness, or widowhood. There is a part in the song that says, "Tell Me your story, show Me your wounds, and I'll show you what Love sees when Love looks at you." That is a profound lyric because when someone tells you he wants to know your story and wants to see your pain, they want to understand you and love you. They want you to be seen and feel that true love. The following lines in the song reflect a pure Godly love bringing comfort within colliding experiences of pain and joy.

> I see what I made in your mother's womb And I see the day I fell in love with you I see your tomorrows, nothing left to chance I see My Father's fingerprints I see your story, I see My name Written on every beautiful page

I especially found comfort in this song when I reconciled with my faith in my journey with God. It is a reminder that even in times of loneliness and struggle, He knows me in every page of my story. In every page where He too is written.
