



February 27, 2022

PREPARING FOR LENT

As we approach the season of Lent, Paul's first letter to the Corinthians gives us a sneak peek of Easter, waiting for us on the other side: "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" Paul's conclusion, telling us to remain steadfast and devoted to the Lord's work, could serve as a Lenten motto. The reading from Sirach provides a series of adages regarding discipline of the tongue, and of our speech. Maybe not a bad Lenten practice to observe. Even Jesus in Luke's Gospel gets into the act, encouraging a cleansing of the heart ("A clean heart create for me, God" we will sing in Psalm 51 during Lent), so that from the goodness of our heart we will bring good into the world. Of course, these insights from Sirach, Paul, and Luke serve us quite well year-round. What we truly do "in the Lord" is never done in vain.

IS THIS ON THE TEST?

Today's reading from Sirach reminds us not to praise others before they speak, "for it is then that people are tested." Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, takes it a step further, reminding us that we are also known by the fruit borne in our lives. It doesn't take long to think of a person or group of people who speak beautiful, praiseworthy words, and yet their lives are unfruitful, or their lives outright contradict their speech. This is the class of people we call "hypocrites," and it's clear in all the Gospels that Jesus has no time for them. Our speech does test us, but the test is really to demonstrate that there is a connection between what we say and how we live. Expressed another way, this is the age-old discussion about faith and works. A truly deep-rooted faith will bear fruit in the works, in the actions of our lives. As happens so often in discipleship, we are dealing with the both/and, not either/or.

TALKING HEARTS

As disciples who follow Jesus, we believe that we are following God's very Word-made-Flesh. The theological term for this is In-carn-ation, the "in-flesh-made" second person of the Trinity. As followers of the Word, our words are truly important. Our hearts and mouths are wired together, as Jesus tells us today: "from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." This is yet another echo of the wisdom of Sirach: "Speech discloses the bent of a person's heart." Eventually, our words—and the other actions of our lives—will convey what is truly in our hearts. Perhaps the ultimate test of our

discipleship is not merely our words, or even our actions, but on a deeper level the test is whether or not others will find in us God's word "in-flesh-made." Our mission is to be the Word-made-flesh, in the flesh again in our own place and time.

TODAY'S READINGS

Sirach 27:4–7 Psalm 92:2–3, 13–14, 15–16 1 Corinthians 15:54–58 Luke 6:39–45



Listen with a heart....

A commentary on the readings of the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time Sir 27:4-7

In the spirit of the Wisdom literature and tradition of Israel, Ben Sira now offers us a profound insight into human experience. Using the image of precious metals that must be screened, or that of the tree that, if well planted, bears good fruit, he tells us about the authentic human being who is revealed by actions and words. One's language and reasoning reveal the human quality of a person.

1 Cor 15:54-58

This is the conclusion of the discourse of Paul regarding the resurrection. The final resurrection of the dead is framed by the Advent of Jesus, the Second

Coming, also known in theology as the

Parousia. The second and final coming of Jesus will encounter us, humans, both living and dead. This encounter will confirm the final victory of life over death, of love over the law, of forgiveness over sin. Liberation from the law and salvation from sin yields a new glorious life of the radically freed humanity and creation. That is why this encounter needs the radical transformation of each one: the final, definitive, decisive and ultimate transformation of humanity and creation. This mystery of the resurrection in fact is already ongoing. But this should not lead to a passive hope. Rather, this should ignite us to progress in our assigned mission, state of life and tasks. The hope in the final glorious resurrection in fact gives meaning to our daily life-struggles and sufferings.

Lk 6:39-45:

Following the exhortations earlier, the disciples (we) are called now to live a life that is radically committed to the proposals of Jesus. In this text, Jesus makes it clear that there is no place for mediocrity, minimalism and lack of auto-criticism (criticism/self-criticism) for those who follow Him. In fact, mediocrity, minimalism and lack of auto-criticism (criticism/auto-criticism) are the main obstacles to the real and effective establishment of God's Kingdom.

We have embarked on the uncharted seas of Synodality. We hope to make this experience now grow deeper and become a way of life of being Church. Walking together in the same path. Discerning together the Signs of the Times. In function of love and service. Through communion, participation and mission. In prayer and imploring the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In fact, the work of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit in each one of us, baptized and non-baptized. The Holy Spirit in creation. In the stones, in the animals, in the insects, in the flowers, in the waters and in the air. In the air we breathed and in the water that we drink. We are loving docile listeners to each other. Loving docile listeners and discerners too of the movement of the Holy Spirit. In each one of us. In our environment. In the world. As groups. As a community. Engaged in Communal Wisdom Discernment.

We are glad that Synodality is taking many forms. In India, it is drawing many religions and faith-traditions much older than Christianity together in this discernment process. In the Philippines, it is starting to sprout from the grassroots, the poor Basic Ecclesial Communities, many with ecumenical participation of our brothers and sisters in the Protestant and Reformed traditions. With an Inter-faith dimension, that includes indigenous folk religions and Islam. In Europe, many are asking: does the Church really have a place for this encounter? Notwithstanding these suspicions and doubts, non-profit organizations, non-government organizations and agencies are involved in the Synodal process. In Africa, various cultures are engaged in lively attempts to walk together in the same path. In Central and Latin America, folk religions, liberation theologies and the people's modern experiences under new government set-ups are in dialogue with each other. And what about in North America? In our parish? How engaged are we in this new synodal way of living as Church?

We have had a series of synodal listening sessions. Profound expressions of joy arising from the experience of being Church. Moving articulations of hurts and disappointments experienced in the Church. Who are taking good care of couples and families in crisis? What models of faith-nourishment is there that takes care of the growth and maturation of the faith from the womb to the tomb? The youth are speaking out. We need to listen to the unchurched, to the nones, beyond the pews and our ministries. And we are going out there... to listen to each other. And chart a new vision, a new structure, a new way of taking care of each other... of believing.. of being inspired by the Holy Spirit...

We do these as tested precious metals, as pruned cultivated trees, so that the best in us can come out... the image of the living God. We do these in the hope of the resurrection: because love is more powerful than hatred and indifference, because sin is overcome by mercy and forgiveness, because death has no sting before a life of justice, and law, with all its punitive content, is basically impotent in the face of the freedom of the dignity of the sons and daughters of God and creation that reflects God's image. We do these with a maximalist attitude in facing the challenges of life. We do these with a humble attitude of auto-criticism (criticism/self-criticism) because we are all sinners in need of God's loving intervention. We do these because we are citizens of the Kingdom of God, first and foremost, and inheritors of God's gracious design.




