AHA!

We can imagine the splendor of the Transfiguration in our Gospel, and in a manner similar to the Baptism of the Lord, we hear the voice of God booming down announcing Jesus the Son. It is another of the great epiphanies. But if you think about it, each reading this weekend has a sort of “Aha” moment to it. A moment of mutual commitment, of trust. In Genesis, God makes a covenant with Abram, promising him descendants numerous as the stars in the sky. The Psalmist professes his faith and hope: “I believe that I shall see the bounty of the LORD in the land of the living.” Paul’s letter to the Philippians lays it out simply in “drop the mic” fashion: “Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.” That’s it. Boom.

THE RECAP

When you watch a TV series, they will often provide a quick synopsis of key events from the last couple of shows to set the stage for the current episode. If we do a quick review of the Gospel of Luke, earlier in chapter nine Jesus was sending the disciples out in ministry for the first time, and we had the feeding of the five thousand. Peter realizes that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus gives us the first hint of his own death and tells the disciples to take up their cross and follow him. After all that physical, spiritual, and emotional stress Jesus goes out to pray on the mountain, taking Peter, John, and James with him.

THIS WEEK’S EPISODE

Once they were settled on the mountaintop, Jesus began to pray in earnest and, as usual, his wingmen fell asleep. The disciples did not yet have the strength or insights of the Master. Peter, James, and John did not yet have the stamina or the depth to be able to focus during long periods of silent, contemplative prayer, especially after their long hike. One might see visions simply due to exhaustion! As Jesus was transfigured before them, Peter might have bumbled around it in typical Peter fashion, but he realized the significance of what they saw, and he wanted somehow to capture the sacred, to capture the moment, so he asked to build some tents. If we imagined this today, we’d all be there with our phones and selfie sticks trying to get an amazing picture of it, to capture the moment, and to share with everyone on social media. But all the disciples could do was remember it, capture it in their hearts—and tell no one at the time. They were silenced by the sacred. We too must let our busy worlds and minds and hearts enter into the silence. Start out with a few minutes daily and continue to add a minute or two more each day. Listen for the sacred in the silence, and let the voice of God fill your heart.

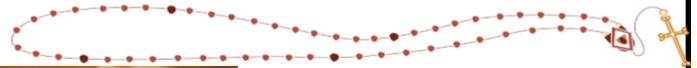

Is God Calling You?

Hello Friends,

My name is Isaias Delgadillo and I am a 6th year seminarian at the Serra House of Formation for the Diocese of San Bernardino. I am currently 27 years old and I have one brother and three sisters, I am the middle child. My home parish is St. John XXIII.

1. What is the meaning of Lent for you?

The season of Lent allows me to reflect on my mortality. As we receive the ashes on Ash Wednesday, the minister says, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust, you shall return." The sign of the cross on our foreheads is a commitment to follow Jesus. We live in a very fast-paced society, and we rarely take the time to ponder on life's most important questions. It is effortless to get caught up in our illusions, goals, and aspirations of life, and we often fail to realize the frailty of our own lives. The season of Lent allows us to reflect on our relationship with God and each other. The pursuit of holiness is a constant struggle. Nevertheless, we are not alone in this earthly pilgrimage, but we walk together to our Heavenly homeland as a Church.

2. Why is it an important time of the year?

It is an important time of the liturgical year because the Church teaches us the basics about Christian living. In other words, we go back to school to relearn the fundamental aspects of the Christian life. The readings for Ash Wednesday set the tone for the whole Lenten Season. They call us to a conversion of heart and teach us about the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These actions are part of the ordinary Christian life, but we renew our commitment to them during this time of the year. In Lent, we prepare ourselves to celebrate the high point of our Christian life. The Church reminds us of our Baptism and the need for penance to prepare for the celebration of Easter. The faithful need to listen more attentively to God's word and devote more time to prayer.

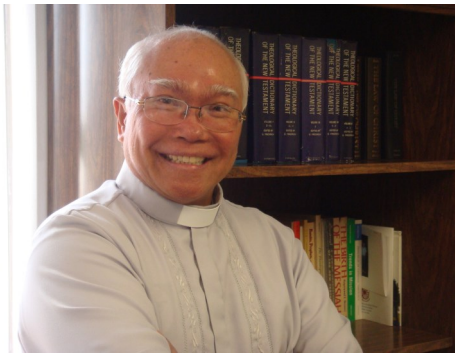

Listen with the heart....

Commentary on the Readings of the Second Sunday of Lent

First Reading: [Gn 15:5-12, 17-18](#)

God takes the initiative to make a covenant with Abraham. This is not a covenant properly speaking but a promise from God. The promised gifts will be inherited by the descendants of Abraham forever. This agreement is sealed symbolically by the animals divided into halves. The unique thing about this covenant between the Lord and Abraham lies in this: God is both witness and party to the covenant-making, with Abraham as the other party. The message: the deep union and intimacy between God and the people. In this intimacy, God – the principal contracting party – is the father; Abraham is the son – the

secondary contracting party; and everyone has become brothers and sisters to one another.

Second Reading: [Phil 3:17—4:1](#)

With tenderness and urgency, Paul proposes to the Philippian Christian community his own life as an example of fidelity to Christ, in radical contrast to the behavior of the “enemies of the cross of Christ”. These “enemies of the cross of Christ” are those who find security in purely human rituals and performances, such as the observances regarding food and, what for them gives the highest pride: circumcision. But the real struggle to which Paul wouldn’t give an inch lies in what’s behind these innocent rites and rituals: the latent idolatry of these religious practices that give more undue importance to passing things while rejecting the higher and loftier aspirations of human existence. Their end is destruction – exploitation of creation and death! Their God is their stomach – unbridled desire, covetousness and greed! Their glory is in their “shame” - a passing pride and honor that cannot partake in the glory of the resurrection and the dignity of the children of God.

On the other hand, Paul proposes a limitless horizon of being human, the limitless horizon of God: “we are citizens of heaven!” A city governed by God S/Himself. This is the Reign of kinship (we are brothers and sisters of one family of God), of love and compassion, of truth and freedom, of mercy and justice, of peace and integrity of creation. This is not a promise of the future. Rather, this is a task that must be done here on earth and now, because of the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a task of establishing an alternative society formed by the “holy ones, those consecrated to Christ who live in Philippi”, and by their descendants – by us in our time and place.

Gospel: [Lk 9:28b-36](#)

This is Luke’s version of the Transfiguration of Jesus. He links this event of the Transfiguration to the preceding announcement of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus (9:22-27) which predictably defined the identity of Jesus as the Messiah of God (9:18-21). Now Luke gives notice to the intimate link between Jesus, the Word of God, and Sacred Scripture: Moses and the Law, on the one hand, and Elijah and the Prophets, on the other. Both the Law and the Prophets give testimony to Jesus and approve of the mission which he is about to undertake. Moreover, if Moses was the greatest teacher in the Old Time, now Jesus is The Only Teacher, and there is no other. If Elijah was the greatest prophet of the Old Time, now Jesus is The Only Prophet, and there is no other. The voice from heaven confirms the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan (3:21ff). Everything of the Old Time converges in him: He is the chosen one to whom we must listen. There is no other. Here, Jesus freely chooses the path of suffering and death, with the support of the Father. The Father too will support anyone who chooses to follow his Son, who desires to be his disciple.

As we enter more profoundly into the Lenten Season, let us be formed by the Word of God in Sacred Scriptures. God desires to be intimately present in us. Can we respond to Her/His desire with such burning intensity in our heart as to desire to be united intimately with Her/Him, and be intimately united with our neighbor and with everything in creation?

In this spirit, let us grow into a more profound conviction that we are first and foremost citizens of heaven and only secondarily of any nation here on earth. We need to see how disproportionately we have given importance to passing things: accumulating possessions at the neglect of the other, the idolatrous exercise of power, oppressive and discriminatory to the other, egoistic individualism and closed exclusive communities that show our being citizens of a decadent and corrupted world.

Let us turn to the Father, let us return to Jesus, listen to him and follow him. Listen to him and to the primacy of love that God has placed in our hearts. Follow him and be his disciples through suffering and death in his mission to liberate the poor, to set the captives free, to give sight to the blind, to liberate the oppressed and to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor. But who is Jesus in our society? What is the mission of Jesus in our society? Who are the poor, the prisoners, the blind and the oppressed in our society? Where are they?

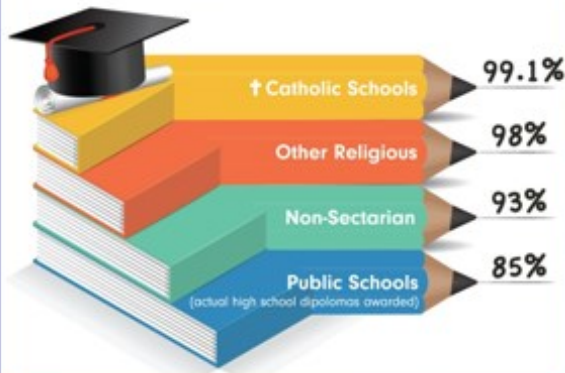

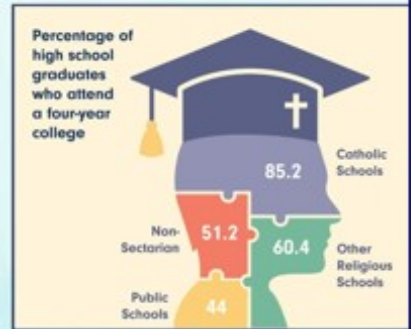
