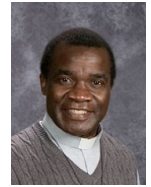

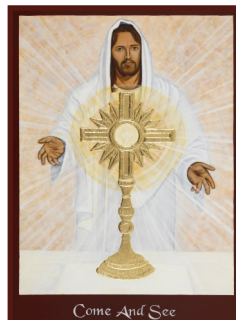

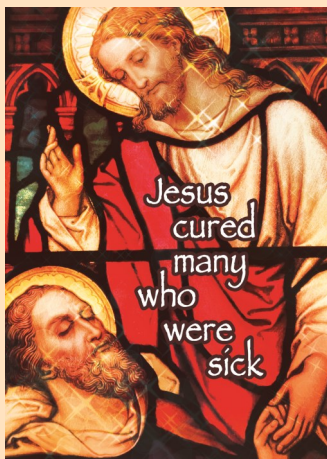

RELYING ON GOD

Face it, the last couple of years have worn us all down. Sometimes we don't know how to pray, or we don't seem to find the words we want. It is easy to falter and waver. Lent is a time to get back to the basics. There is much hope and strength in our readings as we begin our Lenten journey. The letter to the Romans tells us today that “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved,” and this is an idea we hear throughout the scriptures. Psalm 91 shows us exactly how to cry for help, “Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble.” In Deuteronomy, Moses teaches the people to bring their firstfruit offerings to God, and put their faith and trust in God, and Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that we find our life in the word of God.

GOOD ZEAL AND TEMPTATIONS

In the chapter of Luke preceding today's Gospel, Jesus was baptized in the Jordan and began his adult ministry. Immediately afterward he was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tested. While this might seem almost surreal as we imagine the devil taking Jesus from place to place, it is really much more simple and common than that. For many of us, as we strive to live our lives, we deal with many temptations. Sometimes it is a matter of having the zeal and desire, but not the practical experience or knowledge to carry out a goal. Other times, we are afraid to ask for the assistance that we need to carry a project through to completion. Or we might think that we deserve more, or that our results should be happening more quickly. Our egos can be destructive.

KNOWING YOUR TOUCHSTONES

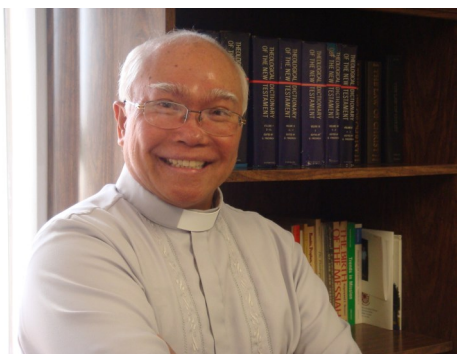
When Jesus found himself tested by the devil, he was given several different scenarios. The devil brought up situations that he knew could specifically test Jesus, but similar situations would test any of us. Physical hunger is a real need, and many of us might yearn for success, or better paying jobs, or power, or the like. The difference is that when Jesus was tempted, he had some strong “touchstones” to hold onto, secure answers to lead him. He went to simple, basic scriptures that he could call upon in his time of need. For many, one of those basics would be Jeremiah, “I know the plans I have in mind for you—plans for peace and not disaster.” For another it might be the Beatitudes or the twenty-third Psalm. Whatever it may be, have ready those touchstones, those “go to” prayers or phrases that you can hold onto during the times when you are sorely tested in your life. Let those stones be your firm foundation.

Listen with the heart....

Commentary on the Readings for Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022:

JI 2:12-18

In a liturgical setting, the prophet describes the situation of total destruction imaged by the plague of the locusts seen also an invading army ready to destroy everything on its way. With a poetic finesse, he presents this national catastrophe as an occasion to show both the punishment of God and the need for divine compassion through a day of fasting and penance which everyone must participate in. Then God will relent and convert his anger into a liberating compassion if there is

genuine sincere repentance born from the heart. It is not enough to rend one's clothes; one must be rent from the heart and do acts of compassion and mercy, because God is good and merciful! This is the way to return to God: make a day of prayer and acts of justice and mercy, of fasting and penance "the day of the Lord."

2 Cor 5:20—6:2

"Now is the acceptable time of the Lord, the day of salvation." In defending the legitimacy of his ministry and the authenticity of his mission against his opportunist detractors and false prophets, Paul presents himself as the Ambassador for Christ. What is really at stake is the legitimacy of the Good News that this ambassador carries with him. If the ambassador is rejected, so is the message. So how will the recipient (Corinthian community) get reconciled with the sender (God) when it has rejected both the messenger (Paul) and the message (Christ)? In fact, we human beings have no capacity by ourselves to reconcile with God. It is God in his great extravagant love and mercy who reconciles us to himself, by sending to us his son, who did not know sin so that we might become the righteousness (justice) of God in Christ. And the time for reconciliation with God is now: when we return ourselves towards him and, together as a community, be with him.

Mt 6:1-6, 16-18

Like most religions in the world, the practice of almsgiving, prayer and fasting are the pillars of the Jewish religion. But the moment these practices are institutionalized, they run the risk of being routinized, superficial and hypocritical. This is Matthew's critique of the Jewish practice and a warning to the early Christian community who, inserted as small communities into the larger traditional Jewish community, is seeking its own identity. Matthew is reminding the Christian community of words of Jesus: purify these practices with the spirit of the Gospel as the criteria for discernment. By this purification, a general principle may be established: the pious acts should not be done in order to gain prestige, or power or privilege. Rather, they should be done as genuine acts of justice (almsgiving), reconciliation with God and with one's neighbor, especially the poor and the needy (prayer), by sharing with them what we voluntarily deprive ourselves with, the extra which we now possess which we have taken away, institutionally stolen away, from those who labor for us (fasting). Matthew dismisses those who practice these pillars of the Jewish religion with ostentatious pomp and show off with mocking sarcasm: hypocrites.

The call of Jesus continues to reverberate in our time: Return, be reconciled to God, to one another and to all creation. This call is most meaningful when we consider our practice of almsgiving, prayer and fasting has become institutionalized, routinized and ritualized as acts of piety rather than as a way of life of love and compassion, of justice and mercy.

As a way of preparing ourselves for the gift of new life of Easter, it might be of help to trace the history of how we have come to this situation. We need to reclaim the reality of this reconciliation: we are reconciled by the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. We need to enter into this mystery of Jesus' suffering – who did not know sin ... that we may become the righteousness of God. We need to enter into the mystery of his death: an act of self-giving and resistance and a confrontation with evil, with the greed for fame, power and privilege. We need to enter into the mystery of the resurrection: the victory of life over death, of love over hatred and egoism, of forgiveness, justice and mercy over sin. Let us make everyday a day of the Lord, the acceptable time of the Lord, the day of salvation.
