




Be Still.

How can I stay focused on building my relationship with God and not get distracted as I continue through my journey during this Lenten Season? There are distractions everywhere. There are noises everywhere. There is all this movement around us. But you need to tune out all these other sounds and go into a place where you can be intimate, quiet with Jesus. Pray in Adoration, in silence. Find a quiet space in your home. It doesn't have to be a particular place, but a time of quietude and solitude.

Perhaps early before others wake. Find moments throughout your day. Find quietness with Jesus.

Psalms 46:10 says, "be still and know that I am God." The knowing will come from being still, from being quiet and in the presence of the Lord. Disconnect yourself from social media, from damaging relationships, from people that are not good in your life. Allow the spirit of God to speak to you in this way you will stay focused on what God has called you for.



LENT



THE LORD HAS DONE GREAT THINGS FOR US

Isaiah prophesies for the Lord: "Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new!" One of the most dangerous things that we can do is get stuck in our old ways. As individuals, as parishes, as nations we can say, "We've always done it that way," and miss calls to growth and change. Throughout this Lent and our lives, God continues to call us to life, and we should celebrate that! The psalmist reminds us that "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy!" Saint Paul realizes this as he explains, "I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus." In the Gospel, Jesus offers a new way of looking at a tricky situation and provides a kinder, less judgmental response.

AN AGE-OLD STORY OF JUDGEMENT

In our Gospel today we hear an ancient story, but one that feels like it could be taken out of the headlines today. We can be very quick to pass judgment on others, those with different political or cultural backgrounds, or perhaps with a different sexual orientation. Jesus was teaching in the temple, and the scribes and Pharisees did not like the message that he was proclaiming or the popularity he was gaining. When a nearby woman was caught in adultery, they thought it was the perfect chance to trip Jesus up, wondering how he would respond when the Mosaic Law provided clear consequences for such behavior. Many would be able to quote instantly chapter and verse of the law pertaining to the infraction. Instead of answering their question, Jesus turned it back on the accusers: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

DRAWING IN THE SAND

Awaiting the response of those challenging him, Jesus bent over and wrote in the sand. According to scripture scholar John Pilch, this was a simple technique that peasants used to buy time in a discussion or argument. Instead of looking the scribes and pharisees in the eye, he looked down and did his own thing while they all slipped away. The scriptures do not tell us what the woman was doing during this time. But by not looking at her, Jesus gave her a chance to restore her own dignity. He didn't comment on her innocence or guilt. Rather, he instructed her to go forth

and sin no more. It is not our past that matters as much as the choices we make now and in the future. Again and again, God gives us the chance to start our life over. This is our challenge this Lent, to continue to use the opportunities we are given to repent and grow.







Let Us Listen with Our Hearts....

Commentary on the Readings of the Fifth Sunday of Lent.

Is 43:16-21 Commentary:

The new exodus, proclaimed in a much more poetic and dramatic way than the first one, is a new experience of liberation which Yahweh will accomplish for His/Her people. This would be more glorious and marvelous than that exodus from Egypt. The first

is a-brewing. The exile is a time of purification and redemption of Israel: the deserts and wastelands with their inhabitants the new place of fertility, productivity and abundance. In this vision the prophet announces the arrival of the new things, of the new time: the new time of freedom, liberation and salvation for humanity and creation who worship God.

2. Phil 3:8-14

Paul rejects physical circumcision which ties the pagan converts to Christianity to the old Jewish conviction regarding the Law: return to the observance of the dictates of the Law in order to merit and achieve salvation by one's own efforts. To this, Paul proposes an alternative: "spiritual circumcision": the real way of worship which God wants, and to glory only Christ, and not on one's own efforts. Then Paul enumerates the gains by one's efforts according to the Law and rejects them all. He considers them as rubbish and a loss when compared to the "supreme good of knowing Christ." He unites himself with Christ, even if such a conviction of faith and life entails the consequences of sufferings that lead to the resurrection.

Jn 8:1-11 3.

This story about forgiveness to a woman caught in adultery demonstrates that all humanity live in a glass house, and thus we cannot just throw stones at our neighbor's house. The men who charge the woman in the very act of committing adultery are themselves guilty of trying to commit adultery with her. Somebody was just ahead of each one of them to her. That's why and how they caught her. But Jesus calls us to compassion and to forgiveness of sinners. Otherwise, who can be forgiven and be saved when everyone else is connected to the structures of sin and evil?

Many of us, if not all, are glad that we are finally going back to the "pre-pandemic" ways of celebrating the liturgy and doing our pastoral action. But it might be good for us to ask as well: wasn't the experience of the pandemic of 2 years our experience of the exile and the possibility of the new exodus in our time? Was there anything new that came about as a result of the pandemic? Did it bring me more closely to Jesus, and radically relativize everything that I am and all that I strove for? Was I able to develop a "domestic church" in these last 2 years? Will I abandon it now, now that the church is open once again? Or is it back to party-party, forgetting that I have been truly generous, and have discovered this inner capacity to be generous, so that others may live and grow while I decrease and be counted as nothing?

Shall I insert myself again to the structures of sin and evil which I have slightly abandoned during the pandemic by a life of simplicity and detachment? Will I go back to the "physical circumcision" that ties me down to the Law and the merits of a good life based on obedience to the Law? Or shall I assert this new found freedom, liberation and salvation in the "spiritual circumcision" that starts and ends with radical love of God and neighbor: Jesus Christ, the love incarnate of God?




U.S. Graduation Rates


