GLORIFY GOD

In the first sentence of today's Gospel passage from John, Jesus' address at the Last Supper, the words "glorify" or "glorified" appear five times. For John, glory has to do with honor and reputation, the primary characteristic of a person. John thus invites us to reflect upon what God's glory fully means. God is glorified when God's truest nature is revealed, as the God who loves. Today's passage is situated between two demonstrations of Jesus' love: the washing of feet and going to the cross. The capacity to glorify God extends to all of us. Like Jesus, love is revealed both in our mundane acts of service and in our acts and commitments of great sacrifice. Jesus' "new commandment," flowing from God's love within us, invites us to extend and deepen our love for others, to include everyone. We may then reveal God's truest nature to everyone, and so glorify God.

MADE FOR EACH OTHER

We are introduced to the book of Revelation's great concluding vision in our second reading. The completion of God's project of salvation is described as a new Jerusalem coming from heaven, to form a new heaven and new earth. The image of a marriage articulates this vision, in which the two sides of God's good creation, earth and heaven, are joined in a final union. Earth (the physical universe) will not be destroyed, but instead be fully renewed.

This vision rejects any notion that the physical and the spiritual are ultimately separate and opposed to each other. It rejects the idea that heaven is an escape from a prison of earthly life. Like a marriage partnership, these two sides of reality are fundamentally made for each other. Life in heaven and life on earth are quite different now. But the life of faith, here and now, offers a foretaste of God's promised future.

ALL THINGS NEW

The new heaven and new earth described by Revelation is where God will dwell fully among God's beloved creation. God's reign will be a reign of love, where death will be no more. In Revelation, death fuels fear and resentment, which turn to cycles of violence and destruction, and to social systems that sustain injustice. These cycles of death will one day be broken by love. In God's reign of love, new energies of creativity and human fulfillment can be released.

When God says "behold, I make all things new," God is speaking of both the present and the future. God is working now, in every person and community, in every part of part of creation, to bring about this new reality. We the Church must learn to see God working

in our lives, our workplaces, and our neighborhoods, breaking cycles of death. We are summoned to join in what God is doing, releasing new energies of love, anticipating the final fulfillment of God's work.



We the people of St. Peter and St. Paul Parish, as members of the Roman Catholic Church, are a sacramental, worshiping community on a journey towards the fulfillment of Christ's Kingdom. We strive to provide a spiritual haven for all people without distinction. We are equally committed to the challenges of the gospel message. We accept its call to ongoing conversion, the use of our gifts for the benefit of our community, and loving service to one another.

Jesus Christ and his Mission in the Gospels

(Please, read the whole gospel of St. Matthew, slowly and reverently). <u>The Matthaean Story:</u> All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have

commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age (Matt 28,18-20).

This ending of the Matthaean gospel seems to be the reason for writing this second story about Jesus. The last sentence of the quote above reminds us of the genealogical opening of the gospel and the fulfillment of the promised son, Emmanuel, God with us (Matt 1:1-23). That makes the whole gospel structurally an inclusion, with the ending a summary conclusion to its narrative beginning. The same structural pattern could be said with regard to the source of the authority of Jesus Christ. The is indicated by the "dream-fulfillment" literary device of chapter 2 and the stories of Jesus' baptism by John in chapter 3, the temptation of Jesus and the call of the apostles in chapter This authority and power have been perceived by the people themselves (7:29; 9:6.8; 11:27). The universalizing intent of the mission of Jesus is already introduced by the geographical movements in his early life. He did not only travel to Egypt (ch. 2); his fame spread to foreign lands, like Syria and beyond the Jordan (4:24.25). But most decisively comes the ringing quote from Isaiah 9:1-2:

...but in the latter time he will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the gentiles/nations. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined" (Matt 4,15-16).

The mission now to "go and make disciples of all nations" calls to mind two focal images of the "the making of disciples" in Jesus' terms, at least according to Matthew. The first is the picture of Jesus communicating his message on some "mountain" (Matt 5:1; 14,23: 17,1). This evokes that Jesus is the greatest prophet and teacher in the Old Testament who received the Law from Mount Sinai. Jesus has brought Moses and his functions for salvation to completion now. And the second is the call of Jesus to a close following of his very own person (Matt 16, 24-26; cf. also 19,21). This is the way he was going to perfect the law and the prophets: his person, and the prescription of radical discipleship on his person, would be the measure. Both are framed within the rabbinical style of "forming disciples": the first points to a Judaeo-Christian missionary experience; the second, to a Christology.

In content, "making disciples" constitutes two elements, namely: (a) baptizing them in the name of the Trinity, and (b) teaching them to observe all that Jesus commanded. The element of baptism brings back to memory what happened to Jesus in his own baptism: the Holy Spirit descending upon him and the Father proclaiming him to be his beloved Son (Matt 3:16-17). The teaching element would be confirmed in the transfiguration of Jesus, when the voice from heaven would add a phrase to the baptismal proclamation used earlier: "listen to him" (Matt 17:5). That is why the gospel of Matthew may be divided into five (5) sections containing the teachings of Jesus concerning the Kingdom of Heaven. These sections are strategically spread around the fundamental structure of Mark's gospel, with the addition of a special Matthaean infancy material and post-resurrection narrative.

- Book 1: Jesus' program of the Kingdom of Heaven (3 7)
- Book 2: The Bringing of the Kingdom of Heaven (8 11:1)

- Book 4: Community Life in the Kingdom of Heaven (13:54 19:1)
- Book 5: Crisis for the Adherents of the Kingdom of Heaven (19:2 26:1)
- Passion Glorification of Jesus Christ


In this sense Jesus is the Teacher proclaimed in the tradition of the Suffering Servant who suffered for the cause of Justice for all the nations, and, in Ps 2:7 the beloved son who would inherit the nations and would possess even the ends of the earth as his Kingdom. For Jesus is the only Teacher, his teachings the Magna Carta of the alternative new things in the Kingdom of Heaven, and there is no other.

Jesus the Teacher:

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus as the Teacher may be described as: (1) he is meek and humble of heart; (2) he disobeyed the Law in order to make effective the Love of God (11:25-30); (3) he forgives from the heart (18:35); and (4) he is moved very deeply with all passions at the sight of people who are like sheep without a shepherd. (9:36).

In this Matthaean presentation of Jesus as Teacher, the Church is an inheritor of the teaching mission of Jesus, her founder.
