Parish Mission Statement

We the people of St. Peter and St. Paul Parish, as members of the Roman Catholic Church, are a sacramental, worshiping community on a journey towards the fulfillment of Christ's Kingdom. We strive to provide a spiritual haven for all people without distinction. We are equally committed to the challenges of the gospel message. We accept its call to ongoing conversion, the use of our gifts for the benefit of our community, and loving service to one another.



Jesus Christ and his Mission in the Gospels

(Please, read the gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, slowly and reverently).

The Lukan gospel has two accounts of the “sending” of the apostles. In the first sending (Luke 9:1-9) when there was as yet no violent opposition, there was no need for missionaries to bring provisions for themselves. But in the second sending (Luke 22:35-38), in the latter days, after Jesus' real identity and mission were revealed, when violent persecution would arise, then there would be a need even for missionaries to fend for and protect themselves.

But more importantly, the second sending occurs in the Last Farewell Address of Jesus. And the valuable words of this dying man included the provision that the twelve bring with them now a sword each, emphasizing the necessity to have one by selling a mantle just to buy it. This is so “that this scripture must be fulfilled in me, ‘And he was reckoned with the lawless’ (“anomos” in Lk 22:37 refers to one who did not recognize the [Jewish] law. In subsequent social histories, resistance fighters to colonial rule and injustice would also be tagged “bandidos, ladrones”, leftists, socialists, communists, terrorists). When shown two swords, Jesus says: ‘it is enough’ (Luke 22:38). Later, when the sword is actually used, in Lk 22:50, Jesus responds: Let it be up to this point! (“No more of this.”[?])

This continues to be a controversial text. Exegetes and biblical commentators are divided on whether this should be taken symbolically (like the heart of Mary being pierced with a sword) or historically (involvement in armed struggle). But it can be both, in a different sense, though: although Jesus in his time did not organize an armed force, yet he was only too willing to be identified with those who take up arms for a just cause. In the Lukan presentation of the trial of Jesus, this fundamental political angle has not been lost.

The Lukan presentation of Jesus as the sign of contradiction takes on another added significance in the formation of the early Christian community, in contra-distinction to the surrounding ordinary human communities. For Luke’s alternative community sets itself radically apart from the one built and supported by the Roman imperial and Jewish sectarian authorities. Acts 2:44-47 and 4:34-37 emphasize the essential and fundamental lifestyle in this new community: they have all things in common, each giving from what one has, each receiving according to each one’s need. In this egalitarian primitive Christian society, the ideals of the theory and practice of community life are lived. And the reason for this is because they believe in Jesus, and they make alive the breaking of the bread, the celebration of the Eucharist as one new alternative community that points to the Reign of God!

“And so we came to Rome” (Acts 28:14). Under the watchful eyes of imperial Rome and rejected by his Jewish compatriots, the Roman citizen and erstwhile zealot Jew and persecutor of the Christian church and recently turned-apostle of Jesus Christ, Paul now preaches this alternative community, this Kingdom of God, right in the belly of the beast “quite openly and unhindered” (Acts 28:31). The apostle to the gentiles will soon deliver the city, Rome, then usurped by human hands – the same hands that supported the leadership of occupied Jerusalem - into the hands of the people, the new alternative Christian community - to which it rightly belongs.

Thus our mission today is also a journey into the heart of human history, providing it with the view of Jesus as the eminent sign of contradiction. This history of salvation is both here and now and hereafter and not-yet. Its faith builds a radical alternative Christian community that holds and shares everything in common. It celebrates the Eucharist as a real fellowship of peoples who dare to love and serve as Jesus did. It denies any superpower of any claim to any imperial lordship and idolatrous domination. It is a mission that asserts the supremacy of the Reign of God. It proclaims the power of God’s merciful love as operative in the projects of the poor for liberation. If the people are kept silent, “the very stones will cry out!” (Luke 19:40)

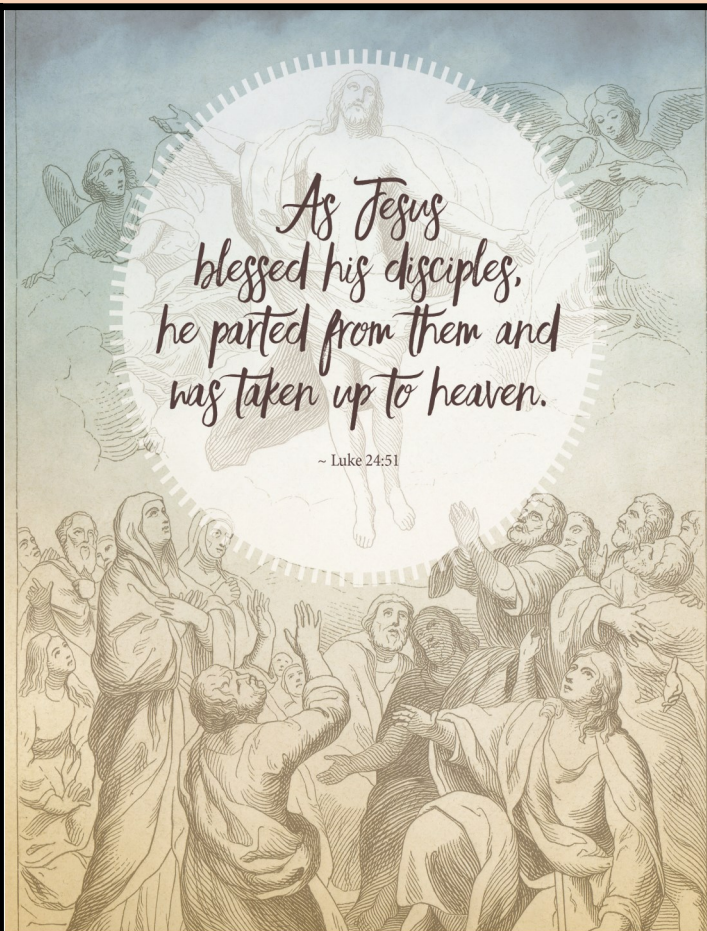
