

Revelation 7:17

WE BELONG TO GOD

In the time of Jesus, when multiple flocks of sheep would be gathered, protecting the flock depended heavily on the shepherd's personal recognition of individual sheep, by sight and sound. In today's Gospel, Jesus uses this imagery to speak of how Jesus - with the Father - protects those whom God loves - that is, everyone. Forces that pull us away from God are ultimately no match for the fierce love that God has for us. Our favor with God does not depend on our behaving properly, or gaining theological knowledge, or holding precise beliefs. Our stance with God is primarily about God's insistence that we belong to God, and to no other. Belonging to God, we know that however much we mess up, we are not lost. Belonging to God eventually draws us into a life of care for each other. Belonging to God, we can safely grow into a fuller belonging.

LIGHT TO THE GENTILES

Today's passage from the Acts of the Apostles is one of several turning points in the self-understanding of the early Church. Paul evokes the image of "A light to the Gentiles." Some thought that Gentiles, non-Jews, were somehow marginal in God's eyes. The Gentiles in Paul's audience rejoice, because they now see that they are not "second class" members of God's family, but fully part of God's beloved people. The story continues by noting the resistance from those who enjoy "first class" status in the community, as inclusion of the Gentiles was perceived as a threat to their self-image and privilege.

The book of Acts continues to challenge today's societies, churches, and organizations. Luke's vision of God's family, united as equal heirs to the Kingdom of God, confronts our many barriers of wealth, race, gender, and much more. We are invited to give witness to this vision in our life together as the Church.

WHITE ROBES

Our reading from the Book of Revelation presents the image of God's people before God's throne, wearing robes that are washed white in the blood of the Lamb. A robe, especially when worn in God's presence, is meant to express the real truth about the person. A white robe indicates their purity. The washing in the blood of the Lamb (Jesus) suggests that the people have met much suffering and, in some manner, have participated in the suffering of Jesus.

These passages were written to a people experiencing great tribulations in living their faith. But the author of Revelation does not suggest that anyone should seek out suffering for its own sake. He does not make suffering somehow a necessary entry pass for

salvation. Our sufferings come from many sources, and suffering is a profound mystery. The image of washing in blood suggests that God is present within our suffering. God accompanies our suffering, leads us toward refreshment, and will wipe every tear from our eyes.



Parish Mission Statement

We the people of St. Peter and St. Paul Parish, as members of the Roman Catholic Church, are a sacramental, worshiping community on a journey towards the fulfillment of Christ's Kingdom. We strive to provide a spiritual haven for all people without distinction. We are equally committed to the challenges of the gospel message. We accept its call to ongoing conversion, the use of our gifts for the benefit of our community, and loving service to one another.



Jesus Christ and his Mission in the Gospels

The first significant story, and the most decisive one, concerning mission in the New Testament is decidedly the story of Jesus, the Messiah. The accounts of the Synoptic gospels portray a Jesus on a missionary journey, from Galilee and the Judaean hills to the city of Jerusalem. Luke, however, extends this missionary journey to Rome in his Acts. While each of them follow the same fundamental pattern of the Jesus' missionary story, still each of them has a different insight to tell. Each of them has his own people and epochal situation to address to, from the inspiration of the Jesus' missionary example.

The Markan Story: Mark's dramatic presentation of the Jesus story revolved around geographical settings and characters in the play. After the inaugural proclamation of Jesus concerning the reason for his coming: The time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel (Mark 1,15), the evangelist speeded up the plot with a sense of great urgency.

At first, he put Jesus preaching around Galilee and the Judaean hills. He never allowed him to enter Jerusalem, until after the confession of Peter (Mark 8,27-30) and the collaboration of this confession in the Transfiguration (Mark 9,1-13). It was only when Jesus' real identity and the mission and fate of this identity were shared, in secret, within a select group of disciples, that he then set his face towards Jerusalem. Arriving there after a long trek (Mark 11,11), Jesus chose not to sleep in the city. For Mark would never allow Jesus to sleep in the city (Mark 11,19; 14,26). In fact, the first thing he made Jesus do in the city was to let him cleanse the Temple, with the prophetic words taken from Isaiah and Jeremiah: My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations (Is 56,7), but you have made it a den of robbers (Jer 7,11).

For Mark, this geographical construction is significant. Galilee and the Judaean hills are symbols of the acceptance of Jesus. It was in those places that the poor lived, the sick were looking for healing and the rich citizens from the city wandered in search of life's meaning and direction. On the contrary, Jerusalem was the symbol of rejection. It was the center of economic, political and socio-cultural power. The Temple embodied this power that had no concern whatsoever for the poor and the sick, and had ceased to be the articulator of life's true meaning and direction. That was why it had to be purified and be given back to God and to his people. The full quote from Isaiah recalled the internationalism of the justice and peace of Yahweh, while the phrase from Jeremiah reminded the state and the temple, and the people in general, of the class character of the mission of Jesus: in the Old Testament prophetic insight, one became rich only by stealing from the people, and in no other way! Jesus was now denouncing and subverting the recurrence of this thievery, legal brigandage and injustice in the temple commerce.

The appearance of the characters and participants in the Markan plot is significant too. Before Mark 8,27-30, every believer in Jesus would always find a corresponding non-believer. As the number of believers increased, so also would the number of opposition be. After Mark 8,27-30, as Jesus gradually entered the fortress of the enemy, his circle of believers would slowly dwindle down, out of fear (Mark 10,32), even as the gang of his enemies would correspondingly grow. And at the moment of his capture (Mark 14,50), until his resurrection, Jesus would completely be alone totally in the hands of those who sought to destroy and to, eventually, kill him: the power holders and the elite of his society. On the cross, Jesus would completely be abandoned even by his own God, when he exclaimed the "why" of forensic justice (Alonso-Schoekel): My God, my God, why have you forsaken me (Mark 15,34)!

After his resurrection, his own people, led by the women who were the first to overcome the fear of being identified with Jesus, were looking for him in Jerusalem, only to be told that they should go back to Galilee, for there the risen Jesus was waiting for them. And the story, this time in the life of the Christian community, would be lived out again.

It seems that this Markan plot was born out of the situation of the Christian community Mark was addressing to. The Christians in Rome had just gone back to that city after their expulsion earlier. But now, they had to contend with a new wave of persecution under Nero. Emperor Nero was then looking for scapegoats to blame for the problems besetting his empire, and a common reason against which he could rally the allegiance of his subjects around his rule. He found his convenient excuse among the believers and followers of Christ (Josephus).

So, Mark had to give his advice to a Christian community undergoing persecution in Rome. Would they also betray and abandon Jesus Christ, give up the faith (apostasy) and break up the Christian community as it happened in the earthly days of Jesus of Nazareth, in order to survive and escape the persecution? Or would they follow Jesus all the way to Jerusalem, even with the seeming absence of their God in the midst of persecution? Would they follow the hidden Suffering Messiah by themselves going "underground" in the hardships in the countryside until they would be ready to enter and reveal themselves and the finality of their mission in the city? Would they go back to their own "Galilee" once again, and from there proclaim the Good News all the way to "Jerusalem" to confront the powers who have converted that City of Justice and Peace into a haven of Plunderers, Thieves and Violent Men and Women? Would they, in fact, as a Christian community, cleanse the "Temple" and be willing to suffer and die in the process?

The reality of the Resurrection ought to deeply convince them to follow the mission of Jesus who brought the fullness of

time, the advent of God's Reign.


