Jesus Christ and his Mission in the Gospels

(Please, read the gospel of John, slowly and reverently).

The Johannine Story:

It has been said that John's introduction to his gospel (1:1-18) constitutes the reason for the Johannine story concerning Jesus. The theme of the mission of Jesus is already embedded in that beautiful introductory hymn. A closer look into the structure of the story woven by the evangelist would show that the ministry of Jesus took place in a three-year period. The last year is now elaborated to highlight his passion and resurrection, his hour of suffering and death as also the hour of victory and glorification.

Jn 2,13.23: 1st passover period

Jn 6,4: 2nd passover period

Jn 11,55: 3rd and last passover period for Jesus

It is in this temporal-historical frame that John would want his proclamation concerning Jesus to be understood. It is a proclamation wrought with much Judaic and Greek/Hellenistic symbolisms. In this temporal-historical frame and philosophical-theological richness John would tell his story.

The Word, the Light, the Truth, the Way and the Life – Jesus Christ, the Messiah and Son of the Living God – is in John's gospel the historical alternative Lamb of God. As the Jews celebrate their feasts and offer their sacrifices, so Jesus would also have his own unique and personalized alternative celebration with his followers (cf. John 5:1: Sabbath day; 7:2: Feast of the Tabernacles; 10:22: Feast of Dedication). While these alternative historical celebrations take place with his person as the center of sacrifice, the plot to kill him also unfolds (John 5:18; 7:1; 7:25.32; 10:31.39). With the last Passover feast coming into his life, the council now decisively sets this murderous conspiracy into its full implementation (John 11:47-53).

Beginning with chapter 12, (note the six days leading to the last Passover feast in the lifetime of Jesus, John 12:1), Jesus would gradually take over the plot from the hands of the conspirators, and with his self-awareness and royal dignity, declare himself a free man. He renders judgment to the world (John 12:31; 16:11, cf. 3:19); he gathers the scattered children of Israel (John 12:32; cf. Is 2:2-5; Jer 31:10) and makes the Cross his Royal Throne (cf. expression "to be lifted up"; John 12:13.32; 18:37; 19:19).

But the tone of John's presentation of the freedom and royal dignity of Jesus is placed within the framework of his singular obedience to the will of the Father who sent him, and of the Paraclete, the Spirit that the Father and the Son will send when Jesus is gone. This framework finds its widest scope from ch. 13 all the way to ch. 20. In here John contextualizes the institution of the priesthood in the washing of the disciples' feet. Here is the longest priestly prayer of Jesus: the last farewell of a dying man and his untouchable royal self-offering on the cross. For the unique royal priesthood of Jesus is this: the victim is the offerer and servant at the same time. The Lamb of God is the Priest, and the Priest is the Lamb of God: victim, servant, offerer – all rolled into one!

This mission of Jesus – to love as to lay down one's life for others, for the event of the Kingship of Jesus, the Christ (John 15) - he shares with the people of God when, on the cross, he gives us his Spirit (John 19,30).

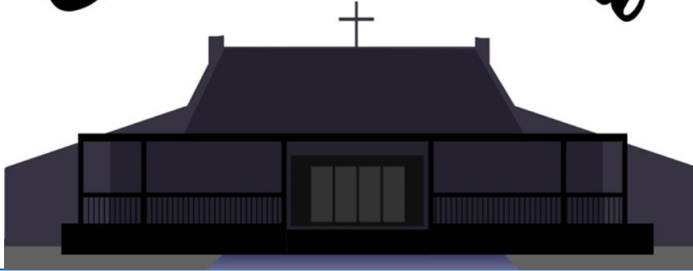
In this mission of Jesus, which is also the mission of the Spirit and of the Christian community that receives his breath, John would always insist on the role of the Trinity. "As the Father has sent me, so I also sent you! Receive the Holy Spirit" (John 3:16; 7:37-39; 16:7-8; 20:21-23). It is the Spirit of Truth (John 14:25-27) and Fearlessness, before the trials of the world and of the courts (John 15:26). It is the Spirit for a community of forgiveness, reconciliation and peace in a world that has rejected the Light. Yet it is the same world that the Light and His people must love and save to the very end, giving it the Peace that only the Spirit can give.

Today, we too are inheritors of this mission of Jesus that he bequeathed to the Church. "Greater life no one has than he who lays down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). We too are inheritors of the mission of the Holy Spirit of Truth and Fearlessness (John 14:15-29) that dares to save the world through love, forgiveness and reconciliation. Indeed, we are the recipients of the heritage of the mission of the Father, the Son and of the Holy Spirit: to create a new world, by loving even unto death, through the wisdom and holiness of the

Spirit (John 19:30-34). — Fr. Ben. MSC

THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY TRINITY

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We say these words as we make the sign of the cross, the sign of God’s saving love for us in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. God who created the heavens, earth, and all who dwell in it. Jesus Christ, through whom we are offered salvation and peace. The Holy Spirit, who breathes life, leads us to the truth, and strengthens us to live as God’s holy people. On this Solemnity, let us pause to reflect upon the mystery of the Holy Trinity, three persons in one God. As we name the mystery, may we come to know God’s love more deeply and live it more profoundly.

PERCEIVE WHAT CANNOT BE SEEN

Have you ever paused on a clear night to look up at the stars, or taken time to notice the splendor of spring flowers, the changing colors of the autumn leaves, or the still beauty of a snow-covered landscape? Such moments of quiet reflection may lead us to a powerful sense of wonder. The same God who created the stars, flowers, trees, and snow created each of us. In sensing God’s presence in the beauty that surrounds us, we may be filled with awe in perceiving what cannot be seen. Moments of wonder and awe may take us by surprise. It may be invisible, yet in these moments we see the hand of God.

LOOK WITH EYES OF FAITH

Not only in the beauty of God’s creation do we sense the presence of the Lord. In times of prayer, especially the celebration of the Eucharist, we are strengthened in faith to be assured of the mystery of the triune God. 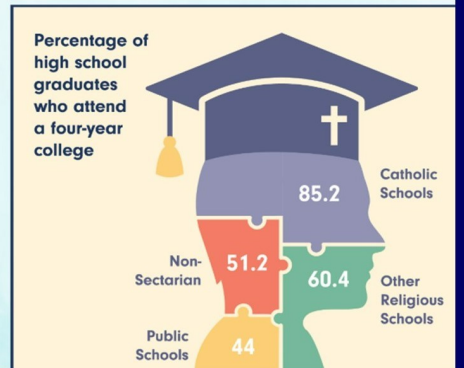
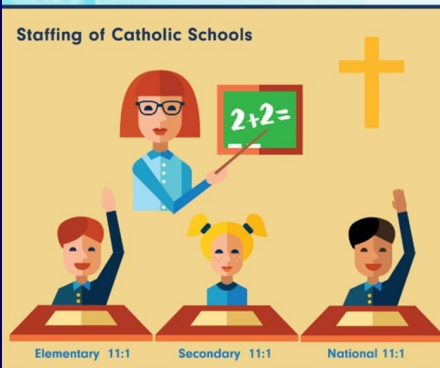

Fr. Michael invites everyone for a Plenary Indulgence on the Occasion of Mass (es) of Thanksgiving of Newly Ordained Priest

When a priest celebrates his First Mass(es) after ordination, it is an opportunity for the faithful in attendance to gain a plenary indulgence if all the usual conditions are met.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. (1983 Catechism ¶1471)

The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are:

- detachment from sin; which is a true sorrow for, and repudiation of, all one's sin, mortal and venial;
- reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought;
- prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or any other suitable prayer);
- sacramental confession within twenty days of completion of the prescribed work.

Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

If these conditions are not met, the indulgence will be partial.

This indulgence may be received by attending any of these Masses and meeting the conditions for the indulgence.
