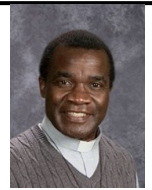

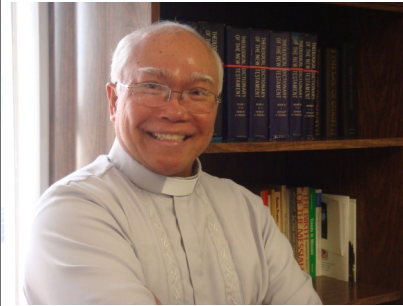

Our Mission Today: To be God's Heart on Earth!

I am a missionary of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and member of the religious congregation of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC). Our Charism is focused on the Heart of Jesus, the incarnate love and compassion of God, who loves us with a human heart. Ours is a Spirituality of the Heart: it "opposes the egoism of our time, its sensuality, its religious indifference by means of the love of a heart that is most self-sacrificing, pure, gentle and compassionate". Our mission is contained in our motto: "May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be loved everywhere, now and forever." It is a mission shared with other religious, the diocesan clergy and the lay. Our Founder Jules Chevalier, and we his Chevalier Family, have a special title for the blessed Mother Mary. We call her "Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, Hope of the Hopeless".

My 8 months and 13 days of imprisonment as a 20-year old political activist in the time of Martial Law of the Marcos dictatorship in the Philippines gave me the opportunity to discover and re-discover God more profoundly than ever. It was a turning point of a "faith that seeks its own understanding" and "moral correctness" at the same time. After the torture (bartolina) and isolation (incommunicado) I went through, I stopped believing in God. At the end of the second month of my detention I roused myself from bed at 2:00am to read the book which I had hated and refused to touch: the bible. Opening its pages, my eyes fell on John 15:13 where Jesus says: "Greater love no one has than he who lays down his life for his friends." And – paraphrasing – should they bring you to court and torture you, remember they did it to me first, and worst! I felt so little and so ashamed of myself. And so I told Jesus: Ok, you win. Whether I get out of prison or not, whether I will become a priest or not, from now on I will continue to serve you among the poor. With that affirmation of belief in Jesus, and the resolve to follow him, I knew I was free. I knew that no four walls of prison could ever imprison and shackle the human spirit.

That was a defining moment of my sense of mission. In 1980 I was sent to study Sacred Scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute, in Rome. The guiding perspective of my studies and research was the life and dreams of the poor and the little ones. It was always a search for the Word of God addressed to humanity in need ("nefesh") and to the "groaning of creation" (ktisis systemazei/synōdinei). Thus I began to focus on the biblical basis of the Mission of Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation.

After 13 years of academic scholarly work, I asked to be sent to mission among "the poorest, the farthest and the most remote" in our Philippine mission. I was happy when I was assigned to live among the indigenous tribes of Northeastern Mindanao (Southern Philippines). Mission here did not consist in converting souls for heaven through counting the numbers of baptisms, marriages, and other sacraments. Rather, mission here was fundamentally a sharing of life with the tribal Filipinos and a dialogue of religious experience with them.

In 1996, in San Luis, Agusan del Sur, Philippines with the 24 Christian and indigenous communities coming from the 4 tribes, I helped found a school that would preserve their indigenous identity, cultural values and customary laws and traditions in dialogue with the lowland cultures, the laws of the Philippine state and the international community. The San Luis Lumad Community High School was a secondary school with an alternative curriculum. (Lumad is the vernacular for indigenous.) Its structures were patterned after the indigenous structures. But something new was introduced: the durability of steel and the concrete. These indigenous communities then resisted open pit mining because it could destroy their environment and ancestral lands and domains. They opposed huge logging concessions because these impoverished their forests (their pharmacy), and the waters (their fishing grounds). I was forced to leave the parish and my ministry with the indigenous people in 1998, for the safety of my person. The state security forces accused me of inciting the people to resist government development programs. Development programs for whom? The indigenous people taught me to understand the Word of God more profoundly, even as they began to see Jesus in their native wisdom, beliefs system, cultural tradition and in their natural environment.

Today I continue with this mission of encounter with Jesus and the poor and the little ones in our time. Always in the light of God's Reign of Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation. Besides the school, with an average of 80 to 100 students, which I continue to support by connecting it to funding agencies, humanitarian institutions and philanthropic persons, I am also helping 5 young people go to college largely through the financial gifts I receive.

Here in St. Peter and St. Paul Church, and later at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Riverside, I continue to be a missionary of the Sacred Heart: to share with one another in dialogue our faith-life and religious experience. This time in a post-colonial and intercultural manner. This is our mission together. Truly, we are all missionaries of God's love, the heart of God on earth. -

Fr. Michael invites everyone for a Plenary Indulgence on the Occasion of Mass (es) of Thanksgiving of Newly Ordained Priest

When a priest celebrates his First Mass(es) after ordination, it is an opportunity for the faithful in attendance to gain a plenary indulgence if all the usual conditions are met.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. (1983 Catechism ¶1471)

The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are:

- detachment from sin; which is a true sorrow for, and repudiation of, all one's sin, mortal and venial;
- reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought;
- prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or any other suitable prayer);
- sacramental confession within twenty days of completion of the prescribed work.

Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

If these conditions are not met, the indulgence will be partial.

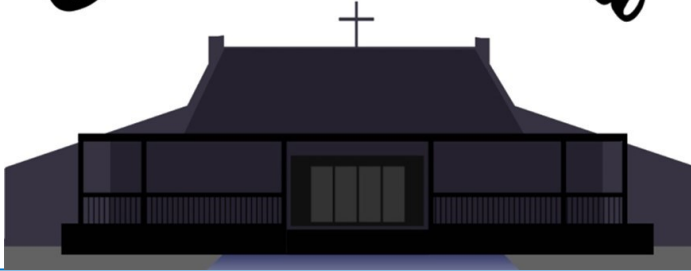

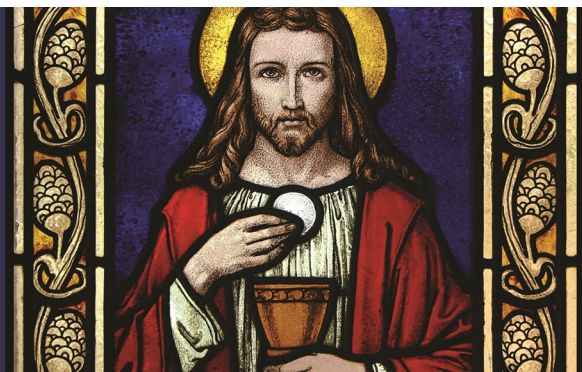

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 19, 2022

THE ABUNDANCE OF GOD’S LOVE

The crowd that followed Jesus to the deserted place was fed, body and spirit. Jesus wanted them to know that in his presence they would find care and compassion. He would not let them go hungry. Like Abram who encountered God in the bread and wine offered by Melchizedek, they experienced first-hand the abundance of God’s love. These sacred meals prefigured the meal most profound, the supper shared by Jesus and his disciples on the night before he died, the feast in which we share in the Eucharist. Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On this day, we appreciate anew the great love of Jesus Christ for us and for the world and experience first-hand the presence of Christ in the sacred meal.

TAKEN, BLESSED, BROKEN, SHARED

We do it so often, we could take it for granted. Yet, the mystery of the Eucharist, our participation in, reception of, and being sent to live as Christ’s Body and Blood is a gift beyond measure. In the desert with the crowd and on the night of the Last Supper, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, said a prayer of blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to those who hungered for physical and spiritual nourishment. Scripture scholars and theologians often remind us that we are to repeat Jesus’ actions of taking, blessing, breaking, and giving—with our lives, resources, and gifts—so that others may know the love of Christ. As Eucharistic people, we are meant to be changed, to become more like the One whom we receive.

GIVE THEM SOME FOOD YOURSELVES

Notice that Jesus sent his disciples to give the crowd the food they needed. Jesus could have done this alone. We could say he didn’t need the disciples to participate in the feeding of the great crowd. But Jesus did not act alone then, and Christ relies on us now, to feed those who hunger and thirst physically, spiritually, and emotionally. When we grow weary and want nothing more than to satisfy our selfish and self-centered impulses, it is good for us to remember who we are and whose we are. It is crucial that we hear in the depths of our hearts, “Give them some food yourselves,” and be ready to do so. On this solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us celebrate Christ’s living presence with and for us and recognize our call to share that presence with others.

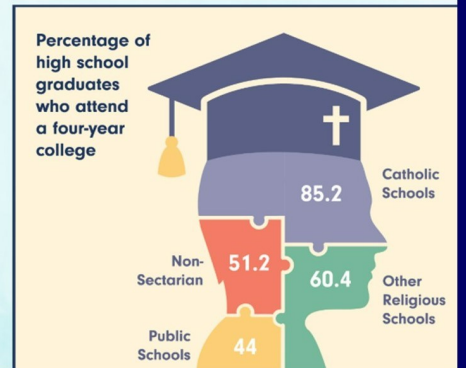
