

Every Knee Shall Bend

I remember when I was growing up, my mom would drive me to school every morning. About a block or two before arriving, I would give my mother a kiss good-bye. I loved my mom, but I was embarrassed to kiss her in front of the school and have my friends see me express affection towards her. Of course, I loved her, and I'm sure she knew that, but I didn't think it would look 'cool' for a 5th grader to be kissing his mom.

Sometimes, we may do the same thing in expressing our love for Jesus. We *love* him, but we may be a bit embarrassed to display that love in public. Maybe we don't want people to stare at us in a restaurant while we cross ourselves and pray before meals. Maybe we're embarrassed to cross ourselves or say a prayer when we pass a Catholic Church. "Sure, Jesus is present in the tabernacle and He knows that I love Him, but I don't want to make the passengers in my car feel uncomfortable." Do you think it's really *them* that we are worried about or could it be that we just aren't very comfortable displaying affection in public to Our Lord and God?

St. Paul tells us "that at the name of Jesus every knee shall bend, of those in heaven and on earth, and under the earth..." (Phil. 2:10) We are called to show reverence and love at the sound of His name. What are we to do then, when we stand before Him, and receive Him? It seems obvious to *me* that we should be crawling on our knees and prostrating ourselves before Him. But, in *many* Catholic Churches it appears everyone is simply queuing up for their 'treat' when coming forward to *receive* Him... possibly feeling that it may not be 'cool' to hug or kiss Him in front of everyone.

A friend of mine shared a story about a Protestant friend of his. When they get together, they will often times discuss each other's faith traditions. The Protestant said to my friend: "If I believed what you Catholic people *say* you believe about Jesus truly present in the Eucharist, I would be on my hands and knees before the altar. I would come dressed like I was attending a banquet and I would be trembling at the thought of whose presence I was about to enter." Even a *non-Catholic* understands what it means to be in the true presence of our King!

We should never be ashamed to show affection to those we love. When we are in the presence of others, showing our love for one another helps us to build our faith, and to see God in those we love. When we come before our Lord and Savior, we want the whole world to know that He is present in us. We can't show that if we don't share it. We can't share it if we don't express it. And we can't express it if we don't believe it. We, as Catholics, must recapture that sense of awe and reverence for our God. He *alone* is our Creator and Ruler of the entire universe. He is Abba...our Father. He gave His only begotten Son to us, so that we may share in His glory with Jesus, our brother.

We should love Jesus as our brother, Lord and Savior. And, God *help* us if we fail to publicly express that love for him.







n the parish church of Weiten, a thief broke into the sacristy and got hold of a consecrated Host that he slipped into one of his gloves. According to reports from the village of Weiten, the theft occurred in 1411. The thief then mounted his horse intending to make for the nearby village of Spitz. Instead of taking the main road, he chose a side road that passes through the valley of Mühldorf and is known as "Am Schuß." When he arrived at the spot (that today is marked by a chapel in honor of the miracle) his horse halted and would not move, no matter how much the man beat him. Some laborers working in the surrounding fields came to help. But there was no way to make the horse move; it stood still as a statue. Then without warning, the animal leaped to a gallop, and the Sacred

consecrated Host from the parish church in Weiten. The Host slipped unnoticed to the ground during his journey and was discovered several days later by a pious woman. The Host glowed brilliantly, divided in two Pieces, but was united by threads of Bleeding Flesh.

of consecrated Hosts, so Church authorities began keeping the Hosts in the sacristy. Despite these

Host hidden in the rider's glove dropped to the ground without anyone noticing.

A few days later, a Mrs. Scheck from Mannersdorf passed by the spot and saw the Host encircled in a strong light. In great wonder, she picked up the Holy Eucharist and noticed that the consecrated Host was broken in two Parts but remained joined together by threads of Bleeding Flesh. Greatly moved and at her own expense, in thanksgiving, she built a small chapel on the spot. As news of the miracle spread, many pilgrims came to the place. Later, it was necessary to build a bigger church to honor the precious reliquary in order to contain the great crowds that came every year on pilgrimage.
