




Luke 20:34-38

Luke 20:34-38

Sinabi ni Jesus, "Sa buhay na ito, ang mga lalaki at mga babae ay nag-aasawa. Ngunit ang mga lalaki't babaing karapat-dapat na mapasama sa muling pagkabuhay ay hindi na mag-aasawa. Hindi na rin sila mamamatay sapagkat matutulad sila sa mga anghel. Sila'y mga anak ng Diyos dahil sila'y napabilang sa mga muling binuhay. Maging si Moises ay nagpapatunay na muling binubuhay ang mga patay. Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."





¡Hola, amigos! Greetings, friends! Kumusta Mga Kaibigan! Dalu kwo nuo! Since I arrived at the end of August, many of you have asked me how I am doing and how I like being sent to this parish. Today, I want to take the opportunity to communicate to everyone that my heart is overflowing with joy because of all the blessings each of you has gifted me. Every activity I partake in, and every encounter I have experienced with each of you in this parish has affirmed my calling to serve others as a priest of Jesus Christ and that this is what I want to devote myself to living for the rest of my life. This affirmation has given me surety and a great deal of peace. Today also marks the beginning of Vocation Awareness Week in the United States.

Before I begin discussing vocations in a religious context, I want to say that our primary vocation as baptized Catholic Christians is to be holy, and we achieve this by doing the Lord's will. The second is to live our vocation based on how God calls us to serve Him in the world. For example, some follow God's call to marriage and raise a family. Others are called to single blessedness, consecrated religious, or as ordained ministers. We do not always know what our calling is, but through prayer, we begin to discover little by little what God's purpose is for us. Whatever your call is, I want to commend you and say thank you for answering the Lord. Both married life and celibate life go hand in hand; we are together in this endeavor of getting closer to the Lord. For example, there can be no priests if we do not have marriages.

Dear friends, thank you for making me a part of this beautiful and dynamic faith community. One of my passions in life is listening to people's stories. Therefore, if you ever feel the need to talk to someone, even if it is just for someone to listen, I would love to hear your story. As for Vocation Awareness Week, if you would like to know more about the formation of priests or how to begin the discernment process, please do not hesitate to ask me. If you feel God is calling you to the priesthood, do not be afraid of God's call. I encourage any of you to "come and see" what this call is about. It does not mean you have to commit to anything. Finally, I ask each of you to please continue to pray for me, and rest assured you all have my prayers. I want to leave you with the words of St. Paul from today's second reading when he says: "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ" (2 Thes 3:5).

#### BE STRONG IN FAITH

Today's readings present us with extreme examples of faithfulness and reliance on the promise of eternal life. Most of us will never be tortured because of our Christian faith, although people are martyred every year because of their commitment to Christ. While we may never face bodily harm as Christians, there are consequences to living as a disciple. We might be ridiculed or harassed. We might find it necessary to call out injustice in the workplace or our local city, and such witness may cost us our jobs and friendships. What are we prepared to do as followers of our Lord? Today, we are encouraged to be strong in faith, secure in the belief that when we endure in Christ, we may look forward to life in eternity with God.

#### THE APPLE OF GOD'S EYE

Any who have a relationship with a child—parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, special friends—know the power of love it is possible to feel for another. It is not that the child is incapable of doing wrong; we know they can and will. Rather, their mistakes do not change our love for them. In fact, the love makes us want what is best for them. Often, we can see their potential with greater perspective than they themselves can. They're the apple of our eye. We are the apple of God's eye, beloved children of our Lord. God knows (God really knows) that we can and will fail. We fall short of the potential that God is certain we have. Yet God does not cease to love us and to call us to live as God's own in the world.

#### HIDDEN IN THE SHADOW OF GOD'S WINGS

Certain that we are held closely by God frees us to live the challenge of the gospel, to give our lives for the sake of others. We will be tempted to take the easy route and ignore the voice of the Lord, listening instead to the call of wealth, power, acceptance, status, and earthly security. Today's readings remind us that we can face temptation, secure that we are hidden in the shadow of God's wings, strengthened and guarded from evil by our Lord Jesus Christ. What challenging thing are you called to do today as a follower

of Jesus? About what must you take a stand? What might be the consequences of discipleship at this time in your life? "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and the endurance of Christ."

It is important, that as liturgical ministers, we receive ongoing spiritual formation at least once a year and are properly prepared to perform our duties.


This year, we are pleased to have as our guest speaker, our own Fr. Andres Rivera.



# Eucharistic Miracle of

## FIECHT

AUSTRIA, 1310

The little village of St. Georgenberg-Fiecht in the Inn Valley is very well known especially because of a Eucharistic miracle that took place there in 1310. During the Mass, the priest was seized with temptations regarding the Real Presence of Jesus in the consecrated Elements. Right after the consecration, the wine changed into Blood and began to boil and overflow the chalice. In 1480, after 170 years, the Sacred Blood was "still fresh as though coming out of a wound," wrote the chronicler of those days. The Precious Blood is preserved intact to this day and is contained in the reliquary in the Monastery of St. Georgenberg.




















ear the side altar of the monastery church there is a documentary tablet that says: "In the year of grace 1310, under Abbot Rupert, a priest was celebrating Holy Mass in this church dedicated to the holy martyr George and the holy apostle, James. After consecrating the wine, he was seized with a doubt as to whether the Blood of Christ was really present under the species of wine. Suddenly the wine changed into red blood that began to boil in the chalice and overflow it. The abbot and his monks, who happened to be in the choir, and the numerous pilgrims who were present at the celebration, approached the altar and realized what had happened. The priest, terrified, was unable to drink all the Holy Blood, and so the abbot placed the remainder in a vessel in the tabernacle of the main altar near the cloth with which the chalice

was wiped. As soon as news of this miraculous event began to spread, more and more pilgrims began to arrive to adore the Sacred Blood. So great was the number of the devotees of the Holy Blood that in 1472 Bishop Georg von Brixen sent the abbot of Wilten, Joahannes Lösch, and the pastors, Sigmund Thaur and Kaspar of Absam, to better study the phenomenon. As a result of this investigation, the adoration of the Blessed Blood was encouraged and the miracle was declared authentic.

"Among the devotees were important Church personalities, like John, Bishop of Trieste; George, Bishop of Brixen; Rupert, Archbishop of Cologne and Duke of Bavaria; and Frederick, Bishop of Chiemsee." A second documentary tablet recounts how the relic of the Holy Blood helped preserve the Catholic faith during the Protestant schism: "When in 1593, the teachings of Luther were spreading everywhere in Tyrol, the monks of St. Georgenberg were asked to preach the faith everywhere. Abbot Michael Geisser was preaching with great success before a large crowd in the parish church of Schwaz and did not hesitate to recall the holy miracle of the Blood as proof of the existence of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. He was disputing in such a convincing way that the adversaries were obliged to leave the scene. This total victory against the false teaching was regarded by the believers as a special grace the Lord was granting His faithful, the adorers of the Precious Blood."
